
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii State Planning Act, chapter 226,
2 Hawaii Revised Statutes, asserts that it shall be the policy of
3 the State to promote economically competitive activities that
4 increase Hawaii's agricultural self-sufficiency, attractiveness,
5 and opportunities for an agricultural workforce and livelihood.

6 The legislature finds that to ensure Hawaii's agricultural
7 self-sufficiency, it is critical to create a workforce
8 development plan that will:

- 9 (1) Introduce Hawaii's youth to agriculture-related
10 activities that will promote an interest and aptitude
11 in agricultural sustainability;
- 12 (2) Engage in an ongoing effort to promote the development
13 of future leaders in the agricultural sector who will
14 have a vision for the future of Hawaii in all sectors
15 of the agriculture industry and its related fields;
- 16 (3) Identify available opportunities for future workforce
17 participants to engage in and further their training



1 to prepare to become members of the agricultural
2 workforce; and

3 (4) Develop a seamless Hawaii P-20 program to transition
4 future agricultural workforce participants into the
5 workforce.

6 SECTION 2. (a) There is created within the department of
7 labor and industrial relations, for administrative purposes
8 only, the Hawaii agriculture workforce advisory board, which
9 shall include the following members or their designees:

- 10 (1) The director of labor and industrial relations;
- 11 (2) The chairperson of the board of agriculture;
- 12 (3) The superintendent of education;
- 13 (4) The dean of the college of tropical agriculture and
14 human resources at the University of Hawaii at Manoa;
- 15 (5) The dean of the college of agriculture, forestry, and
16 natural resource management at the University of
17 Hawaii at Hilo;
- 18 (6) A chancellor of a community college within the
19 University of Hawaii system, selected by the other
20 members of the advisory board;
- 21 (7) The president of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation;
- 22 and



1 (8) A representative from the farming community to be
2 selected by the chairperson of the board of
3 agriculture.

4 All provisions of section 26-34 shall apply as appropriate. The
5 director of labor and industrial relations shall serve as the
6 chairperson of the advisory board.

7 (b) The advisory board shall be responsible for:

- 8 (1) Developing the next generation of the agriculture
9 industry workforce in the State;
- 10 (2) The mission, direction, and goals of the advisory
11 board;
- 12 (3) Developing partnerships with agricultural
13 organizations and stakeholders to further the advisory
14 board's mission and objectives;
- 15 (4) Maintaining and supporting the National Future Farmers
16 of America Organization within the State; and
- 17 (5) Recommending projects and programs to promote the
18 expansion and development of the agricultural industry
19 in the State.

20 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
22 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and



1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
2 year 2014-2015 to assist in the establishment and support of the
3 Hawaii agriculture workforce advisory board.

4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
5 of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
