
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
3 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
4 the Hawaii state constitution.

5 PART II

6 SECTION 2. There are appropriated or authorized from the
7 sources of funding indicated below to program planning,
8 analysis, budgeting (BUF 101) the following sums, or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary, to fund for fiscal
10 biennium 2011-2013 all collective bargaining cost items for
11 salary increases and other wage related costs in the arbitrated
12 settlement for collective bargaining unit 11:

10 for state officers and employees excluded from collective

3 SECTION 7. Funds appropriated or authorized by this Act
4 that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2013, shall
5 lapse as of that date.

6 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Budget and Finance

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING EMERGENCY
APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING
COST ITEMS.

PURPOSE: To provide fund authorizations and
appropriations for fiscal biennium 2011-2013
for all collective bargaining cost items for
salary increases and other wage related
costs in the arbitrated settlement for
collective bargaining unit 11.

MEANS: By the submittal of a specific appropriation
measure.

JUSTIFICATION: Fund authorizations and appropriations by
the Legislature are necessary to cover the
expected cost of implementing the arbitrated
settlement for the employees of collective
bargaining unit 11, and for state officers
and employees excluded from collective
bargaining unit 11 for the fiscal biennium
commencing July 1, 2011.

Inasmuch as the arbitrated settlement with
the bargaining unit was not completed in
time to include the cost items in the
2011-2013 biennium budget, a separate
measure is proposed for submittal to the
Legislature.

Impact on the public: "(I)t is the public
policy of the State to promote harmonious
and cooperative relations between government
and its employees and to protect the public
by assuring effective and orderly operations
of government. These policies are best
effectuated by (1) recognizing the right of
public employees to organize for the purpose
of collective bargaining, (2) requiring the
public employers to negotiate with and enter
into written agreements with exclusive

representatives on matters of wages, hours, and other conditions of employment, while, at the same time, (3) maintaining merit principles and the principle of equal pay for equal work among state and county employees" (Section 89-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes).

Impact on the department and other agencies:
Pay raise and other negotiated cost items are not included in the departments' operating budget request.
