BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. On March 23, 2010, the President signed into 2 law the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, also 3 known as the Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148). The Affordable 4 Care Act added section 511 to title V of the Social Security Act 5 to create the Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home 6 Visiting Grant program to support development and implementation 7 of evidence-based home visiting program models by states and 8 other eligible entities. 9 Home visiting is a prevention strategy used by states and 10 communities to improve the health and well-being of women, 11 children, and families at risk for adverse health and safety
- hospitalizations, emergency room visits, unintended pregnancies, and other more costly outcomes and interventions.
 The purpose of this Act is to establish a program within the department of health for screening and home visiting services for newborns' families. Establishment of Hawaii's home

4	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding to part XXV a new section to be appropriately
6	designated and to read as follows:
7	"§321- Hawaii home visiting program; established. (a)
.8	There is established within the department of health the Hawaii
9	home visiting program, which shall be responsible for statewide
10	hospital-based screening and home visiting services to identify
11	families of newborns at risk for poor health and safety
12	outcomes, including child abuse and neglect, to promote healthy
13	child development and strengthen families.
14	(b) The hospital-based screening and home visiting program
15	shall, within the limits of available funds:
16	(1) Include proactive, universal screening of all births,
17	using a tool designated by the department of health;
18	and
19	(2) Refer families at high risk to Hawaii home visiting
20	program providers who shall employ evidence-based
21	models of service."
22	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
23	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000, or so

1	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 to
2	carry out the purposes of this Act. The sum appropriated shall
3	be expended by the department of health.
