A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HOME VISITING PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. On March 23, 2010, President Barack Obama 1 signed into law the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act 2 of 2010, also known as the Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148). 3 The Affordable Care Act added section 511 to title V of the 4 Social Security Act to create the Maternal, Infant, and Early 5 Childhood Home Visiting Grant program to support development and 6 implementation of evidence-based home visiting program models by 7 states and other eligible entities. 8 Home visiting is a prevention strategy used by states and 9 communities to improve the health and well-being of women, 10 children, and families at risk for adverse health and safety 11 concerns, including child abuse and neglect. Early investments 12 in home visiting programs have been shown to reduce costs 13 associated with foster care placements, hospitalizations, 14 emergency room visits, unintended pregnancies, and other more 15 costly outcomes and interventions. 16 The purpose of this Act is to establish a program within

5	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended by adding to part XXV a new section to be appropriately		
7	designated and to read as follows:		
8	"§321- Hawaii home visiting program; established. (a)		
9	There is established within the department of health the Hawaii		
10	home visiting program, which shall be responsible for statewide		
11	hospital-based screening and home visiting services to identify		
12	families of newborns at risk for poor health and safety		
13	outcomes, including child abuse and neglect, to promote healthy		
14	child development and strengthen families.		
15	(b) The hospital-based screening and home visiting program		
16	shall, within the limits of available funds:		
17	(1) Provide proactive, universal screening of newborns'		
18	families, using one or more screening tools validated		
19	for identifying levels of risk for poor health and		
20	safety outcomes and child abuse and neglect as		
21	designated by the department of health;		

1	(2)	Refer families at high risk to Hawaii home visiting	
2		program providers who shall employ evidence-based	
3		models of service; and	
4	<u>(3)</u>	Consider as a high priority, families at risk for poor	
5		health outcomes, child abuse, or neglect."	
6	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
7	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,000,000 or so much	
8	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 to carry	
9	out the p	urposes of this Act.	
10	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
11	health.

13	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
