# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CERTAIN FUNDS UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that certain funds in the SECTION 1. department of labor and industrial relations are classified and 2 operated incongruently from their statutory designations. 3 According to the legislative auditor's report no. 12-10, issued 4 on December 7, 2012, the confusion in classifying funds may be 5 due to the inconsistency between the name given to the fund by 6 7 the statute that establishes it; the definitions provided by the 8 department of accounting and general services; and the definitions of special, revolving, and trust funds contained in 9 10 the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

11 The purpose of this Act is to clarify the classification of 12 five of the department of labor and industrial relation's funds 13 as trust funds as recommended by the legislative auditor.

14 SECTION 2. Section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows:

16 "\$383-121 Unemployment compensation <u>trust</u> fund;
17 establishment and control. There is established in the treasury



of the State as a [special] trust fund, separate and apart from 1 2 all public moneys or funds of the State, an unemployment compensation fund, which shall be administered by the department 3 of labor and industrial relations exclusively for the purposes 4 of this chapter. All contributions pursuant to this chapter 5 shall be paid into the fund and all compensation and benefits 6 7 payable pursuant to this chapter shall be paid from the fund. 8 All moneys in the fund shall be mingled and undivided. The fund 9 shall consist of: All contributions collected pursuant to this chapter; 10 (1)(2) Interest earned on any moneys in the fund; 11 Any property or securities acquired through the use of 12 (3) moneys belonging to the fund; 13 14 All earnings of such property or securities; (4)15 (5)All moneys credited to this State's account in the unemployment trust fund pursuant to section 903 of the 16 Social Security Act, as amended; and 17 All other moneys received for the fund from any other 18 (6) 19 source." 20 SECTION 3. Section 386-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 21

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"(a) There is hereby created a <u>trust</u> fund to be known as
the special compensation fund which shall consist of payments
made to it as provided by law. The director of finance of the
State shall be custodian of the fund, and all disbursements
therefrom shall be paid by the director of finance upon orders
by the director of labor and industrial relations."

7 SECTION 4. Section 392-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended to read as follows:

"§392-61 Establishment of [special] trust fund for 9 disability benefits. There is established in the treasury of 10 the State, separate and apart from all public moneys or funds of 11 the State, a [special] trust fund for disability benefits which 12 shall be administered by the director exclusively for the 13 purposes of this chapter; and for the establishment and 14 maintenance of a family leave data collection system under 15 16 section 398-9.5. All contributions pursuant to this part shall be paid into the fund and all benefits payable under this part 17 shall be paid from the fund. The fund shall consist of (1) all 18 contributions collected pursuant to this part, together with any 19 20 interest thereon; (2) all fines and penalties for the fund pursuant to this chapter; (3) all moneys collected by way of 21 subrogation; (4) interest earned on any moneys in the fund; (5) 22 HB928 HD1 LRB 13-1319.doc



any property or securities acquired through the use of moneys
 belonging to the fund; (6) all earnings of such property and
 securities; and (7) all other moneys received for the fund from
 any source."

5 SECTION 5. Section 393-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "[+]§393-41[+] Establishment of [special] premium 8 supplementation trust fund. There is established in the treasury of the State, separate and apart from all public moneys 9 10 or funds of the State, a [special] trust fund for premium 11 supplementation which shall be administered exclusively for the 12 purposes of this chapter. All premium supplementations payable 13 under this part shall be paid from the fund. The fund shall 14 consist of (1) all money appropriated by the State for the 15 purposes of premium supplementation under this part and (2) all 16 fines and penalties collected pursuant to this chapter."

SECTION 6. To conform to the change in the name "special fund for disability benefits" to "trust fund for disability benefits," the title of part IV of chapter 392, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and sections 392-28(3) and (4), 392-42.5(b), 392-43(f) and (g), 392-45, 392-46, 392-47, 392-52, 392-62, 392-63, 392-64, 392-65, 392-67, 392-69, 392-72(a), 392-78(d), and 392-92(b),



Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the word "trust fund" or like term, wherever the words "special fund" or like term appears, as the context requires. SECTION 7. To conform to the change in the name "special fund for premium supplementation" to "trust fund for premium supplementation," sections 393-33(a) and 393-34(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the words "trust

8 fund" or like term, wherever the words "special fund" or like 9 term appears, as the context requires.

10 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
