## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO GRANT FULL VOTING RIGHTS FOR RESIDENTS OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

WHEREAS, the United States Constitution provided for the 1 establishment of a federal district, known as Washington, 2 District of Columbia, and the residents of the federal district 3 were allowed to vote for members of the United States House of 4 5 Representatives from the time of incorporation in 1791 until 6 1801; and . 7 WHEREAS, the passage of the Organic Act of 1801 placed the 8 District of Columbia under the exclusive authority of the United 9 States Congress and abolished residents' right to vote for 10 members of Congress and the President and Vice President of the 11 United States; and 12 13 WHEREAS, residents of the District of Columbia were granted 14 the right to vote for the President and Vice President through 15 passage of the Twenty-third Amendment to the United States 16 Constitution in 1961, which Hawaii was the first state to 17 18 ratify; and 19 WHEREAS, Congress has allowed the District of Columbia to 20 send a nonvoting delegate to the United States House of 21 Representatives since 1971; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Congress passed a constitutional amendment in 1978 24 to grant full voting rights to District of Columbia residents 25 26 and, although it was ratified by Hawaii and 15 other states, the proposed amendment was ultimately unsuccessful, thus keeping the 27 right to vote for congressional representation out of reach for 28 District of Columbia residents; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the District of Columbia has 601,723 residents, as 31 of the 2010 census, which according to the 2010 census is 32

comparable to the populations of Wyoming (563,626), Vermont 1 (625,741), North Dakota (672,591), and Alaska (710,231); and 2 3 WHEREAS, District of Columbia residents share all the 4 5 responsibilities of citizenship, including paying federal taxes, serving on federal juries, and defending the United States as 6 members of the United States Armed Services in every war since 7 8 the War for Independence, yet they are denied full 9 representation in Congress; and 10 WHEREAS, the District of Columbia's economy is larger than 11 the economies of more than 15 states; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the lack of federal representation severely limits 14 the ability of residents of the District of Columbia to 15 influence legislation on matters directly affecting them, 16 including health, gun control, budgeting, taxes, and governance; 17 and 18 19 WHEREAS, the United States is a signatory to international 20 treaties calling for countries to grant full voting rights to 21 its adult citizens, including the International Covenant on 22 Civil and Political Rights, the Organization of American States' 23 American Declaration of the Rights and Duties of Man, and the 24 Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination; 25 and 26 27 WHEREAS, in 2003, the Inter-American Commission on Human 28 Rights of the Organization of American States found the United 29 States to be in violation of international human rights law for 30 its disenfranchisement of District of Columbia residents; and 31 32 WHEREAS, Benjamin Cayetano, as Governor of the State of 33 Hawaii, recognized the fundamental right to representation of 34 District of Columbia residents and proclaimed August 2002 35 "District of Columbia Voting Rights Month"; and 36 37 WHEREAS, the White House has affixed the District of 38 Columbia's "Taxation Without Representation" license plates on 39 the presidential limousine and other vehicles, with a 40 representative of the President stating that President Obama 41 "has seen first-hand how patently unfair it is for working 42 families in the District of Columbia to work hard, raise 43 children and pay taxes, without having a vote in Congress. 44 HCR106 HD1 HMS 2013-3120-1

Attaching these plates to the presidential vehicles demonstrates 1 the President's commitment to the principle of full 2 representation for the people of the District of Columbia and 3 his willingness to fight for voting rights, home rule, and 4 5 budget autonomy for the district"; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in 2013, several measures have been introduced in the United States Congress that provide for greater 8 representation and autonomy for the residents of the District of 9 Columbia; now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 12 13 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that members of the 14 113th United States Congress are urged to enact federal 15 legislation or propose a constitutional amendment granting full 16 voting rights to residents of the District of Columbia; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 20 United States, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, 21 the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the 22 District of Columbia's congressional delegate, and members of 23

24 Hawaii's congressional delegation.
