# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE SUPPORT OF THE REPEAL OF COMBAT EXCLUSIONARY  
RULES.

1           WHEREAS, the United States military has an epidemic rate of  
2 rape in all branches of the armed services; and  
3

4           WHEREAS, in her book, "The Lonely Soldier: The Private War  
5 of Women Serving in Iraq", Helen Benedict refers to several  
6 studies of the military funded by the United States Department  
7 of Veteran Affairs; and  
8

9           WHEREAS, according to these studies, thirty per cent of  
10 military women are raped while serving, seventy-one per cent are  
11 sexually assaulted, and ninety per cent are sexually harassed;  
12 and  
13

14           WHEREAS, the United States Department of Defense  
15 acknowledges the problem, estimating in its 2009 annual report  
16 on sexual assault, that approximately ninety per cent of  
17 military sexual assaults are never reported; and  
18

19           WHEREAS, the combat arms specialties of the United States  
20 military continue to foster misogynist attitudes such as those  
21 expressed in this still-popular Jody call: "Who can take a  
22 chainsaw, Cut the bitch in two, F\*\*\* the bottom half, And give  
23 the upper half to you..."; and

25           WHEREAS, military policy provides that women cannot be  
26 assigned to units whose primary mission is to engage the enemy;  
27 these policies are not based on women's proven abilities; and

29           WHEREAS, where and how women serve in the military should  
30 be based on ability and training, not gender; and

1 WHEREAS, in today's all-volunteer force, women have  
2 accepted the challenges, responsibilities, and dangers of  
3 military service, and have proven themselves time and time  
4 again; and

5  
6 WHEREAS, closing combat specialties do not keep women out  
7 of combat or safe; and

8  
9 WHEREAS, women have been toting M60 machine guns and M16  
10 rifles into the forefront of battle zones for decades; and

11  
12 WHEREAS, these combat exclusionary rules keep women from  
13 promotion, in contrast to exclusively male combat specialties  
14 that are often fast-tracked; and

15  
16 WHEREAS, there is a failure of leadership with regard to  
17 women on and off the battlefield; and

18  
19 WHEREAS, women and gay service members are harassed and  
20 assaulted as too many male commanders tolerate such abuse; and

21  
22 WHEREAS, senior military leaders of both genders have  
23 stated that combat exclusionary rules degrade both morale and  
24 readiness; now, therefore,

25  
26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
27 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
28 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the President and  
29 the United States Congress are requested to immediately repeal  
30 the combat exclusionary rules as contrary to good order and  
31 discipline and as the humane, ethical thing to do; and

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the  
35 United States of America, the Secretary of Defense, the Majority  
36 Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United  
37 States House of Representatives, and members of Hawaii's  
38 congressional delegation.
