
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE FEDERAL ADMINISTRATION TO NEGOTIATE A FREE TRADE
AGREEMENT WITH TAIWAN.

1 WHEREAS, a longstanding, close bilateral relationship,
2 codified in the federal Taiwan Relations Act, has existed
3 between the United States and Taiwan and has proven
4 economically, culturally, and strategically important to both
5 countries; and

6
7 WHEREAS, Taiwan is a robust democracy, significant United
8 States trading partner, and an important and strategic United
9 States ally; and

10
11 WHEREAS, together, Taiwan and the United States promote a
12 shared belief in freedom, democracy, and market principles; and

13
14 WHEREAS, Taiwan has consistently ranked among the top
15 twelve United States trading partners for over two decades; and

16
17 WHEREAS, according to 2008 data, the United States is
18 Taiwan's third-largest trading partner, and Taiwan is the United
19 States' twelfth-largest trading partner; and

20
21 WHEREAS, a free trade agreement between Taiwan and the
22 United States would build on their existing strong relations to
23 simultaneously boost Taiwan's security and democracy and serve
24 the broader interests of the United States in the Asia-Pacific
25 region; and

27 WHEREAS, a free trade agreement between Taiwan and the
28 United States would encourage greater innovation and
29 manufacturing efficiencies by stimulating joint technological
30 development, practical applications, and new cooperative
31 ventures; and



1 WHEREAS, Taiwan has become the world's largest producer of
2 information technology hardware and ranks first in the
3 production of notebook computers, monitors, motherboards, and
4 scanners; and

5
6 WHEREAS, the United States is a significant supplier of
7 electrical machinery and appliances, transport equipment,
8 scientific instruments, and chemical products to Taiwan; and

9
10 WHEREAS, a 2002 United States International Trade
11 Commission report found that exports by some sectors of the
12 United States economy, including automobiles, agricultural
13 products, and research medicines, would increase significantly
14 in percentage terms if the United States entered into a free
15 trade agreement with Taiwan; and

16
17 WHEREAS, Taiwan was admitted to the World Trade
18 Organization in January 2002, resulting in reduced Taiwanese
19 tariffs and increased market access for foreign investment; and

20
21 WHEREAS, as a member of the World Trade Organization,
22 Taiwan is entitled to the same rights as any other member nation
23 to enter into free trade agreements with other countries of its
24 choosing; and

25
26 WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China is initiating
27 negotiations on an economic cooperation framework agreement with
28 Taiwan; and

29
30 WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China and Taiwan have
31 opened air transport links with each other; and

32
33 WHEREAS, the European Chamber of Commerce has urged Taiwan
34 to sign a free trade agreement with the European Union; now,
35 therefore,

37 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
38 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
39 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature
40 supports the negotiation of a free trade agreement between
41 Taiwan and the United States; and

43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature encourages the
44 President of the United States to launch negotiations as soon as





1 possible with Taiwan for the establishment of a free trade
2 agreement between the two democracies; and


4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this

11 the United States Office of Management and Budget, the President
12 of Taiwan, the President of Taiwan's Legislative Yuan, and the
13 Representative of the Taipei Economic and Cultural
14 Representative Office in the United States.








