## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO PAVE AND  
ADEQUATELY MAINTAIN KAMILONUI ROAD IN HAWAII KAI TO SUPPORT  
THE KAMILONUI VALLEY FARMING COMMUNITY AND PROVIDE SAFE  
ACCESS FOR GOVERNMENT SERVICES.

1 WHEREAS, Kamilonui Road, located in Kamilonui Valley, is in  
2 a severe state of disrepair, and serves Hawaii Kai's last  
3 remaining agricultural community, which comprises eighty-seven  
4 acres of Kamilonui Valley on fourteen farm lots; and  
5

6 WHEREAS, Kamilonui Road is used daily by many community  
7 members including both farmers of the Valley and a large number  
8 of recreational users who walk and jog on the road; and  
9

10 WHEREAS, the road is used frequently by government services  
11 including city, state, and federal agencies such as city  
12 sanitation, emergency medical services, the Board of Water  
13 Supply, the Department of Agriculture, and the U.S. Postal  
14 Service, and is also used by the Hawaiian Electric Company to  
15 maintain utility lines; and

17 WHEREAS, Kamilonui Valley farmers were provided only an  
18 additional fifteen-year lease extension by Kamehameha Schools to  
19 remain on their lands; and  
20

21 WHEREAS, farming in Kamilonui Valley has not been a  
22 lucrative enterprise and many farmers in the valley are  
23 struggling just to make ends meet; and



25 WHEREAS, the farmers will lose their land when their leases  
26 expire in thirteen years, and the remaining time does not allow  
27 for either the financing or amortization of extensive road  
28 repairs, which, along with all other infrastructure, will revert  
29 to Kamehameha Schools; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
2 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
3 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the City and County  
4 of Honolulu is requested to pave and adequately maintain  
5 Kamilonui Road in order to serve not only the area's farmers and  
6 other residents for the next thirteen years, but also to provide  
7 safe access for government services that utilize the road on a  
8 daily basis in support of this unique community; and

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
11 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City  
12 and County of Honolulu, the Managing Director of the City and  
13 County of Honolulu, Councilmember Stanley Chang, the Chairperson  
14 of Hawaii Kai Neighborhood Board No. 1, and the Board of  
15 Directors of Livable Hawaii Kai Hui.
