
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO ESTABLISH A STROKE
SYSTEM OF CARE IN THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, stroke is the leading cause of chronic disability
2 among adults in the State; and

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4 WHEREAS, rapid identification, diagnosis, and treatment of
5 stroke can improve outcomes for stroke patients; and

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7 WHEREAS, Hawaii needs an effective system to support the
8 rapid assessment and triage of stroke patients and provide
9 appropriate stroke treatment in a timely manner; and

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11 WHEREAS, a stroke system of care will improve the overall
12 care of stroke patients, increase patients' chances of survival,
13 and decrease the incidence of long-term disabilities associated
14 with stroke; and

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16 WHEREAS, such a system of care is recommended in *Hawaii's*
17 *Plan for the Prevention of Heart Disease and Stroke*, issued by
18 the Department of Health in November 2011; and

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20 WHEREAS, a stroke system of care should be established in
21 the State to evaluate, stabilize, and provide emergency and
22 inpatient care to patients with acute stroke; now, therefore,

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24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
25 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
26 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
27 Health is urged to convene a task force to establish a stroke
28 system of care in the State that includes a statewide stroke
29 database and registry by December 31, 2015; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the membership of the task
2 force comprise government, non-profit, and private health care
3 entities and include the following individuals:

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- 5 (1) The Director of Health or the Director's designee;
- 6
- 7 (2) The Emergency Medical Services Directors of each
8 county, or the Directors' designees;
- 9
- 10 (3) A representative of Healthcare Association of Hawaii,
11 who shall identify and invite chief medical officers
12 or their designees from all hospitals with emergency
13 departments to participate as members;
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- 15 (4) A representative from the Hawaii Neurological Society;
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- 17 (5) A representative from the American College of
18 Emergency Physicians, Hawaii Chapter;
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- 20 (6) A representative from the Neurotrauma Advisory Board
21 established under section 321H-3, Hawaii Revised
22 Statutes;
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- 24 (7) A representative from the American Heart Association
25 or the American Stroke Association;
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- 27 (8) A member of the House of Representatives appointed by
28 the Speaker of the House;
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- 30 (9) A member of the Senate appointed by the Senate
31 President; and
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- 33 (10) Any additional stakeholders identified by the task
34 force as necessary; and
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36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in developing a stroke system
37 of care, the task force is requested to:

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- 39 (1) Examine and identify barriers to quality care for
40 stroke patients;

- 42 (2) Review and assess national models, best practices,
43 guidelines, and standards of stroke care, comparative
44 to Hawaii's needs;



- 1 (3) Update information regarding the stroke plan in the
2 *Hawaii Plan for the Prevention of Heart Disease and*
3 *Stroke*, issued by the Department of Health in November
4 2011, including a needs assessment that, in
5 particular, assures that neighbor island issues are
6 adequately addressed;
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- 8 (4) Focus on ensuring that patients at risk of stroke are
9 provided care, at minimum, at a stroke support
10 facility based on criteria developed and used by the
11 American Heart Association, American Stroke
12 Association, or Brain Attack Coalition;
13
- 14 (5) Use uniform pre-hospital protocols for the assessment
15 of stroke to alert appropriate hospitals to prepare
16 for potential acute stroke patients prior to their
17 arrival at the hospital;

- 19 (6) Seek alignment with the State's Healthcare
20 Transformation priorities, including the requirements
21 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and
22 federal meaningful use of health information
23 technology priorities;

- 25 (7) Include requirements for the measuring, reporting, and
26 monitoring of stroke care performance through data
27 collection;

- 29 (8) Establish a statewide stroke database and registry in
30 which all hospitals and healthcare facilities can
31 participate and consider the feasibility of
32 integrating the data registry component through
33 American Heart Association or American Stroke
34 Association super-user licensure for the Department of
35 Health; and

- 37 (9) Recommend protocols regarding direct transportation of
38 stroke patients to appropriate hospitals by emergency
39 medical personnel; and
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41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to
42 propose legislation necessary to support Hawaii's stroke care
43 continuum; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the statewide stroke database
2 and registry include performance measurements obtained using a
3 standardized stroke measure set containing data that is
4 consistent with nationally-recognized guidelines on the
5 treatment of individuals with confirmed stroke within the State,
6 such as the American Heart Association's "Get With The
7 Guidelines - Stroke" or The Joint Commission's "Stroke
8 Performance Measurement Implementation Guide"; and
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10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to
11 submit:

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13 (1) An initial report to the Legislature by December 31,
14 2013; and
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16 (2) A final report to the Legislature no later than 20
17 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of
18 2015,
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20 of the task force's actions taken and progress made, including
21 findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation and
22 recommended funding levels, to establish a stroke system of care
23 that includes the creation of a statewide stroke database and
24 registry; and
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26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
27 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director
28 of Health, Senate President, Speaker of the House of
29 Representatives, Mayors of the respective counties, Chairperson
30 of the Neurotrauma Advisory Board, Executive Director of the
31 American Heart Association of Hawaii, President and CEO of the
32 Healthcare Association of Hawaii, President of the Hawaii
33 Neurological Society, and the President of the American College
34 of Emergency Physicians, Hawaii Chapter.
