## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO ESTABLISH A STROKE SYSTEM OF CARE IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, stroke is the leading cause of chronic disability among adults in the State; and

WHEREAS, rapid identification, diagnosis, and treatment of stroke can improve outcomes for stroke patients; and

WHEREAS, Hawaii needs an effective system to support the rapid assessment and triage of stroke patients and provide appropriate stroke treatment in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, a stroke system of care will improve the overall care of stroke patients, increase patients' chances of survival, and decrease the incidence of long-term disabilities associated with stroke; and

WHEREAS, such a system of care is recommended in Hawaii's Plan for the Prevention of Heart Disease and Stroke, issued by the Department of Health in November 2011; and

WHEREAS, a stroke system of care should be established in the State to evaluate, stabilize, and provide emergency and inpatient care to patients with acute stroke; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is urged to convene a task force to establish a stroke system of care in the State that includes a statewide stroke database and registry by December 31, 2015; and

Update information regarding the stroke plan in the 1 2 Hawaii Plan for the Prevention of Heart Disease and Stroke, issued by the Department of Health in November 3 2011, including a needs assessment that, in 4 5 particular, assures that neighbor island issues are adequately addressed; 7 8 Focus on ensuring that patients at risk of stroke are provided care, at minimum, at a stroke support 9 facility based on criteria developed and used by the 10 American Heart Association, American Stroke 11 Association, or Brain Attack Coalition; 12 13 (5) Use uniform pre-hospital protocols for the assessment 14 of stroke to alert appropriate hospitals to prepare 15 16 for potential acute stroke patients prior to their arrival at the hospital; **17** 18 (6) Seek alignment with the State's Healthcare 19 Transformation priorities, including the requirements 20 21 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and federal meaningful use of health information 22 technology priorities; 23 24 25 (7) Include requirements for the measuring, reporting, and monitoring of stroke care performance through data 26 collection: 27 28 29 (8) Establish a statewide stroke database and registry in which all hospitals and healthcare facilities can 30 participate and consider the feasibility of 31 integrating the data registry component through 32 American Heart Association or American Stroke 33 Association super-user licensure for the Department of 34 Health; and 35 36 37 (9) Recommend protocols regarding direct transportation of stroke patients to appropriate hospitals by emergency 38 medical personnel; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 41

propose legislation necessary to support Hawaii's stroke care

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the statewide stroke database and registry include performance measurements obtained using a standardized stroke measure set containing data that is consistent with nationally-recognized guidelines on the treatment of individuals with confirmed stroke within the State, such as the American Heart Association's "Get With The Guidelines - Stroke" or The Joint Commission's "Stroke Performance Measurement Implementation Guide"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to submit:

(1) An initial report to the Legislature by December 31, 2013; and

(2) A final report to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2015,

of the task force's actions taken and progress made, including findings, recommendations, and any proposed legislation and recommended funding levels, to establish a stroke system of care that includes the creation of a statewide stroke database and registry; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, Senate President, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Mayors of the respective counties, Chairperson of the Neurotrauma Advisory Board, Executive Director of the American Heart Association of Hawaii, President and CEO of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii, President of the Hawaii Neurological Society, and the President of the American College of Emergency Physicians, Hawaii Chapter.
