## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS THAT INCLUDE HEALTH AS A PRIORITY IN LAND USE PLANNING AND TRANSPORTATION DECISIONS.

WHEREAS, obesity is a major health and economic concern for Hawaii and the nation, causing higher medical costs and lower quality of life; and

WHEREAS, in Hawaii, one in three children entering kindergarten is overweight or obese and one in two adults is overweight or obese; and

WHEREAS, obesity-related medical expenditures in Hawaii were calculated to be over \$470 million in 2009, and are continuing to rise; and

WHEREAS, obesity is a complex and multifaceted issue requiring the collaboration of stakeholders in government, non-profit, private, and health care sectors to create systematic large-scale environmental changes; and

WHEREAS, in the past two decades, the environments that afford opportunities for physical activity have changed drastically, and thus obesity prevention initiatives need to focus on creating environments that provide opportunities for physical activity; and

WHEREAS, due to the significant effect of the built environment on health and the direct effect that transportation decisions have on land use and community design, Hawaii must work on transforming the current transportation and land use planning systems to achieve transportation and land use policies that promote health; and

 WHEREAS, all levels of government (federal, state, and local) have important responsibilities in transportation and land use planning. From zoning regulations to the construction of transportation systems, government decisions regarding land use have a significant impact on public health; and

WHEREAS, public health practitioners play a critical role in achieving this transformation; and

WHEREAS, discussion between public health practitioners and all levels of government needs to take place to ensure coordination and collaboration between transportation and land use planning stakeholders; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is requested to establish a Healthy Community Design Task Force tasked with:

(1) Developing legislative recommendations that include improved health as a priority in land use planning and transportation decisions, including, but not limited to, creating policies and funding for bicycle and pedestrian facilities on all appropriate streets, roads, and highways statewide and adding health as a consideration in land use planning policies and decisions;

(2) Identifying agencies with funding or regulatory resources that can influence transportation and land use planning;

(3) Creating goals and performance metrics for outcomes including, but not limited to, health and obesity;

(4) Creating an action plan to achieve those metrics, which addresses changes needed in laws, policies, procedures, agency funding, and regulatory processes; and

(5) Identifying synergistic initiatives and organizations for successful implementation of the action plan, including, but not limited to, Aging in Place,
