## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING ALL PUBLIC FACILITIES TO ESTABLISH SECURE BICYCLE PARKING  
AREAS, CONDOMINIUMS TO CONSTRUCT SECURE BICYCLE PARKING  
WHEN CONDUCTING RENOVATIONS, AND THE COUNTIES TO CONSIDER  
SECURE BICYCLE PARKING IN FUTURE VERSIONS OF THE BUILDING  
CODE.

1           WHEREAS, bicycle riding is a healthy, economical, and  
2 environmentally friendly alternative to driving a motor vehicle;  
3 and

4  
5           WHEREAS, the manufacturing and operation of a bicycle  
6 requires less natural resources and creates less pollution than  
7 a motor vehicle; and

8  
9           WHEREAS, riding a bicycle for transportation potentially  
10 helps the cyclist to improve overall health and generally become  
11 a more productive employee who requires less time off for  
12 illness; and

13  
14           WHEREAS, bicycles provide mobility for those who cannot  
15 afford or are not able to drive motor vehicles; and

16  
17           WHEREAS, during 2010, there were 313,214 registered  
18 bicycles in the City and County of Honolulu, amounting to about  
19 one registered bicycle for every three people; and

20  
21           WHEREAS, many people would like to use a bicycle for  
22 transportation, but the lack of secure bicycle parking  
23 facilities at many places does not encourage bicycling; and

24  
25           WHEREAS, most places with bicycle parking only include a  
26 bicycle rack with minimal security making it easy for a thief to  
27 quickly cut a lock and steal the bicycle; and

1 WHEREAS, in 2011, more than a thousand bicycles were stolen  
2 on Oahu; now, therefore,





4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
5 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
6 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that places of public  
7 accommodation, including shopping centers, universities, and  
8 government facilities, are urged to establish secure bicycle  
9 parking areas including locked facilities, guards, and other  
10 means of safeguarding bicycle parking areas; and  
11

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that condominiums in the State are  
13 urged to consider including or adding secured bicycle parking  
14 when renovating parking facilities; and  
15

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State and counties are  
17 encouraged to consider requiring secured bicycle parking in the  
18 design of their facilities in future versions of building codes;  
19 and

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the  
23 Comptroller, the President of the University of Hawaii, the  
24 President of Hawaii Pacific University, the President of  
25 Chaminade University, the President of Brigham Young University-  
26 Hawaii, the Mayor of each county, the Director of each county's  
27 planning department, and the Director of Commerce and Consumer  
28 Affairs who in turn is requested to transmit copies to the  
29 managing or leasing agent for all shopping centers and boards of  
30 directors of all of the condominium associations in the State.
