HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE VARIOUS BRANCHES OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED SERVICES IN THE STATE OF HAWAII, IN COOPERATION WITH THE MILITARY AFFAIRS COUNCIL OF THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE OF HAWAII, TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO ASSESS THE FEASIBILITY OF A CONSOLIDATED MILITARY TRANSITION, IMMERSION, AND EDUCATION CENTER.

WHEREAS, military personnel and their family members play a 1 2 vital role in Hawaii's economy and make up a significant 3 percentage of the population; and 4 WHEREAS, the transition to settle in, find a home, enroll 5 children in school, transport pets, and register a vehicle is 6 7 significantly more difficult when relocating to Hawaii than when relocating within the continental United States; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in addition to a seamless relocation and 10 transition, newly transferred military personnel and their 11 12 family members need resources to integrate and connect with the 13 community in a meaningful way; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Hawaii is uniquely rich in culture and diversity and a move to Hawaii can often feel more like a move to another 16 country than a move within the United States for families moving 17 18 from the continental United States; and 19 20 WHEREAS, traditional military models for transition, immersion, education, and wellness services are general and do 21 not incorporate "local" resources in the communities that 22 23 surround the military facilities; and 24 25 WHEREAS, transition, immersion, and education programs 26 would strengthen the military relocation process by centralizing the information available to military members and their families 27 and engaging them in Hawaii's community; and 28

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WHEREAS, an education program would also encourage Hawaii 1 residents to reach out and interact with new military members in 2 3 the State; and 4 5 WHEREAS, various service branches located on Oahu retain 6 their own informational and support channels for members 7 relocating to Hawaii, but on an ad hoc basis; and 8 9 WHEREAS, consolidation of the various military branch 10 information and support systems into one resource center will 11 provide the benefits of economies of scale, resulting in equal and enhanced support for the military community in the State; 12 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, a resource center would also serve as an 16 innovative model for other such centers nationwide and may serve as an important prototype for the United States Department of 17 Defense to save money, especially given recent federal budget 18 19 cuts; now, therefore, 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 22 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the various 23 24 branches of the United States armed services in the State of Hawaii, in cooperation with the Military Affairs Council of The 25 Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, are urged to establish an 26 interagency working group to assess the operational and 27 budgetary feasibility of a Consolidated Military Transition, 28 Immersion, and Education Center; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group include, but 31 not be limited to, representatives from the following agencies, 32 departments, or groups: 33 34 35 (1)All military bases and facility commanders; 36 (2) Senior enlisted personnel and their spouses from all 37 38 military bases in Hawaii; 39 (3) Hawaii National Guard; 40 41 (4) Hawaii State Legislature; 42 43 (5) Office of the Governor; 44 HCR90 HD1 HMS 2013-3250

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
