HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON ENERGY SECURITY.

WHEREAS, in January 2013, Tesoro Corporation announced 1 2 plans to shut down its oil refinery in Kapolei, Hawaii, and convert the facility into a terminal operation; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the shutdown of Tesoro's refinery is expected to 6 result in over 200 layoffs at the facility and is likely to impact more than 2,000 jobs in the region; and 7 8 WHEREAS, currently, Hawaii does not have the capacity or 9 10 infrastructure to convert its power plants, automobiles, and jet turbines to alternative fuel sources; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, for the foreseeable future, refined petroleum products will constitute a substantial portion of the State's 14 energy mix; and 15 16 WHEREAS, despite the shutdown and conversion of Tesoro's 17 oil refinery, demand for fuel in Hawaii will continue, likely 18 exposing the State and its residents and visitors to a 19 significant increase in the price of fuel; and 20 21 WHEREAS, in Executive Order 13-01, Governor Neil 22 Abercrombie established the Hawaii Refinery Task Force to 23 24 examine the impact of the closure of the Tesoro refinery, but the task force did not examine alternative efforts the State 25 could take to prevent the closure of the refinery; now, 26 therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 29 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 30 Session of 2013, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature 31 32 convene a Legislative Task Force on Energy Security; and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Task Force on 1 2 Energy Security shall be charged with identifying: 3 4 Barriers to a potential sale of the refinery and (1)5 providing recommendations to state and federal agencies on how to address and overcome those 6 7 barriers; 8 9 (2) Legislative, administrative, and regulatory concerns 10 that potential buyers may have in choosing to enter 11 the refining industry in Hawaii and recommending 12 strategies on how to address those concerns; 13 (3) Incentives that a qualified buyer of refinery assets 14 may seek in pursuing an investment and assessing the 15 16 feasibility of those incentives; 17 18 (4) Potential alternative green energy uses of the 19 refinery assets, including conversion to green diesel 20 fuel production; and 21 Incentives that state agencies may provide to (5) 22 encourage Tesoro to actively pursue opportunities to 23 24 sell the refinery to a qualified operator; and 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the membership of the 26 Legislative Task Force on Energy Security shall include: 27 28 The Senate President or the Senate President's 29 (1)30 designee; 31 (2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives or the 32 Speaker's designee; 33 34 35 (3) The Director of Business, Economic Development, and . Tourism, or the Director's designee; 36 37 (4) A representative of United Steelworkers Local 12-591; 38

7 8 9 10 11 12 13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members on the Legislative Task Force on Energy Security shall not be compensated for their service on the Task Force but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses, including travel expenses, incurred by serving on the Task Force; and
14 15 16 17 18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members on the Legislative Task Force on Energy Security shall not be made subject to Chapter 84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's participation as a member of the Task Force; and
13 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Task Force on Energy Security is requested to submit to the Legislature a preliminary report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later than 45 days after it first convenes, an interim report no later than October 15, 2013, and a final report no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2014; and
