## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO EXEMPT CERTAIN CORAL SPECIES IN ALL COMMERCIAL HARBORS IN THE STATE OF HAWAII FROM RECLASSIFICATION UNDER A PROPOSED FEDERAL RULE CHANGE.

1 WHEREAS, the geographic isolation of the State of Hawaii 2 results in its residents' crucial dependence on ocean surface 3 transportation for the importing of goods through the State's 4 commercial harbors; and

6 WHEREAS, 80 percent of goods consumed in the State are 7 imported and nearly 99 percent of those imported goods are 8 maintained, received, and processed through the State's 9 commercial harbor system; and

WHEREAS, no other state in the United States is as
dependent on ocean transportation and its commercial harbor
systems as Hawaii; and

WHEREAS, the State's commercial harbor system, and by extension, ocean transportation, is the State's connection to national and international economies, supporting every facet of the State's local economy, including tourism, construction, national defense, agriculture, and all other industries; and 20

WHEREAS, as part of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric 21 22 Administration's ongoing responsibilities under the Coral Reef Conservation Act of 2000 and the National Coral Reef Action 23 Strategy, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is 24 currently considering adding 66 reef-building coral species to 25 the Endangered Species Act, including two species, Montipora 26 patula and Montipora flabellate, which are the fourth and fifth 27 most abundant coral in the waters surrounding Hawaii; and 28



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WHEREAS, the Hilo Harbor New Day Work Project was delayed 1 for three years and incurred an additional cost of \$4,300,000 to 2 mitigate potential damage to 80 square feet of coral that was 3 4 found growing in the commercial harbor; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Honolulu Harbor New Day Work Projects and other 7 commercial harbor projects in the State will require similar efforts to mitigate coral damage, which is likely to add 8 considerable expense to the projects; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the State's commercial harbor facilities and 11 commercial importation and transportation activities would be 12 severely impacted by a federal designation of any endangered 13 coral that is prevalent in the State's commercial harbors; now, 14 15 therefore. 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 17 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 18 Session of 2013, that the President of the United States and the 19 20 United States Congress are requested to exempt the Montipora patula and the Montipora flabellate species of coral in all 21 harbors in the State of Hawaii from reclassification under the 22 23 proposed rule, "Endangered and Threatened Species: Listing of 66 Reef-Building Coral Species; Reclassification of Elkhorn 24 Acropora palmata and Staghorn Acropora cervicornis" (77 FR 25 73219); and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States; 29 United States Secretary of Transportation, Interior, and 30 Commerce; members of Hawaii's congressional delegation; Acting 31 Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric 32 Administration; Governor; Chairperson of the Board of Land and 33 Natural Resources; and the state Director of Transportation. 34

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
