HOUSE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE SUCCESSFUL NEGOTIATION OF A TRANS-PACIFIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT BETWEEN AUSTRALIA, BRUNEI, CANADA, CHILE, MALAYSIA, MEXICO, NEW ZEALAND, PERU, SINGAPORE, VIETNAM, AND THE UNITED STATES.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is located in the middle of 1 the Pacific Ocean and forms a bridge between the many nations of 2 Asia, the Pacific, and South America; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii draws economic and cultural strength from its ties with the nations surrounding the Pacific 6 Ocean; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the successful hosting of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Leaders' Meeting held in Honolulu, 10 Hawaii in November 2011, demonstrated the benefits of 11 international cooperation and symbolized Hawaii's central role 12 in the Asia-Pacific Century; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Trans-Pacific Partnership comprising 15 Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, 16 Peru, Singapore, the United States, and Vietnam offers a 17 potential pathway to the APEC goal of free and open trade and 18 investment in the Asia-Pacific region; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement will deepen economic linkages among its members by opening up trade 22 in goods and services, boosting investment flows, and promoting 23 closer links; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Trans-Pacific Partnership will assist in 26 increasing United States exports and providing more and better 27 jobs for Americans as well as residents of the State of Hawaii; 28 now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 32 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, that this body endorses the successful 33 HR LRB 13-1360.doc

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Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement between Australia, Brunei, 2 Canada, Chile, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, Singapore, 3 Vietnam, and the United States, that makes doing business in the 4 region faster, more economical, and easier, and encourages the 5 participation of small- and medium-sized business in trade; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body encourages the United States Congress to favorably consider passage of the Trans-9 Pacific Partnership Agreement and endeavor to bring negotiations 10 to a successful conclusion by the end of 2013; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body encourages the 13 business community in the State of Hawaii to voice its support 14 for the Trans-Pacific Partnership Agreement and to develop 15 proposals that would create economic opportunities for Hawaii; 16 and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body commits to supporting the development and implementation of the Trans-Pacific 20 Partnership Agreement and stands ready to support the hosting of 21 a future negotiating round in Hawaii if called upon to do so; 22 23 and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 25 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, 26 the members of Hawaii's Congressional delegation, and the 27 Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, who in 28 turn is requested to transmit certified copies of this 29 Resolution to the heads of the nations and their respective 30 legislative bodies in Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, 31 Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, Singapore, and Vietnam. 32 33 34 35 OFFERED BY: c0.
