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HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE STATE MEDICAID PROGRAM'S COMPLIANCE WITH THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that fraud, abuse of systems, and waste cost state Medicaid programs a combined estimate of \$18,000,000 per year; and
5 6 7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, the Center for Program Integrity within the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services reports that fraud, abuse of systems, and waste can be significantly attributed to medical coding errors, the provision of unnecessary medical services, improper billing practices, and deceptive billing; and
11 12 13 14 15	WHEREAS, the United States Government Accountability Office study, "Medicare and Medicaid Fraud, Waste, and Abuse," dated March 9, 2011, indicated that fraud, abuse of systems, and waste put all social service programs, including Medicare and Medicaid, at risk; and
16 17 18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, in designating Medicare and Medicaid as "high- risk" programs, the United States Government Accountability Office stressed the need to implement strategies to reduce fraud, abuse of systems, and waste, as well as reduce improper payments; and
22 23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii's Medicaid enrollment reached approximately 290,496 members by the end of fiscal year 2012 and its Med-Quest enrollment has increased more than 35 percent since 2008; and
28 29 30 31 32 33	WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has current contracts with managed care health plans to provide coverage for its Medicaid populations, including both Quest and Quest Expanded enrollees, with the Department of Human Services providing federally- mandated accountability and oversight pursuant to the Federal Balanced Budget Act of 1997; and



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WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the problems of 1 2 fraud, abuse of systems, and waste within Medicaid programs have led to higher costs for Medicaid programs throughout the 3 4 country; and 5 WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 6 2010 requires the states to submit plans detailing proposed 7 methods to increase post-payment reviews aimed at identifying 8 payment errors and recouping overpayments; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, Medicaid program integrity within managed care health plans and other programs is of vital importance to the 12 13 State of Hawaii; and 14 WHEREAS, transparency would be increased and areas of 15 weakness more easily identified within the State of Hawaii's 16 Medicaid programs if the Department of Human Services provided a 17 report on Medicaid compliance with the Patient Protection and 18 Affordable Care Act of 2010; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 22 Session of 2013, that the Department of Human Services is 23 24 requested to conduct a study on the State Medicaid program's compliance with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act 25 of 2010, including a timeline for compliance for fiscal years 26 2012-2013, 2013-2014, and 2014-2015; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services submit a comprehensive report to the Legislature of its 30 findings and recommendations including any proposed legislation 31 32 no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 35 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services. 36
