HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO REPORT ON THE STATE MEDICAID PROGRAM'S COMPLIANCE WITH THE PATIENT PROTECTION AND AFFORDABLE CARE ACT.

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that fraud, abuse of 1 systems, and waste cost state Medicaid programs a combined 2 estimate of \$18,000,000 per year; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Center for Program Integrity within the 5 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services reports that fraud, 6 abuse of systems, and waste can be significantly attributed to 7 medical coding errors, the provision of unnecessary medical 8 9 services, improper billing practices, and deceptive billing; and 10 WHEREAS, the United States Government Accountability Office 11 study, "Medicare and Medicaid Fraud, Waste, and Abuse," dated 12 March 9, 2011, indicated that fraud, abuse of systems, and waste 13 14 put all social service programs, including Medicare and Medicaid, at risk; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, in designating Medicare and Medicaid as "highrisk" programs, the United States Government Accountability 18 Office stressed the need to implement strategies to reduce 19 fraud, abuse of systems, and waste, as well as reduce improper 20 payments; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii's Medicaid enrollment reached 23 approximately 290,496 members by the end of fiscal year 2012 and 24 its Med-Quest enrollment has increased more than 35 percent 25 since 2008; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has current contracts with 28 managed care health plans to provide coverage for its Medicaid 29 30 populations, including both Quest and Quest Expanded enrollees, with the Department of Human Services providing federally-31 mandated accountability and oversight pursuant to the Federal 32 33 Balanced Budget Act of 1997; and



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WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that the problems of 1 fraud, abuse of systems, and waste within Medicaid programs have 2 led to higher costs for Medicaid programs throughout the 3 4 country; and 5 WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 6 2010 requires the states to submit plans detailing proposed 7 8 methods to increase post-payment reviews aimed at identifying payment errors and recouping overpayments; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, Medicaid program integrity within managed care health plans and other programs is of vital importance to the 12 13 State of Hawaii; and 14 15 WHEREAS, transparency would be increased and areas of weakness more easily identified within the State of Hawaii's 16 Medicaid programs if the Department of Human Services provided a 17 18 report on Medicaid compliance with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 21 22 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 23 Session of 2013, that the Department of Human Services is requested to report on the State Medicaid program's compliance 24 with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010, 25 including a timeline for compliance for fiscal years 2012-2013, 26 27 2013-2014, and 2014-2015; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services submit the report to the Legislature no later than 20 30 days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2014, 31 32 2015, 2016, and 2017; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 35 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services.
