HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS AND THE HAWAII PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION TO DEVELOP DRAFT LEGISLATION ESTABLISHING, IMPLEMENTING, AND MONITORING CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL LICENSED PSYCHOLOGISTS IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, the profession of psychology provides critically 1 needed services in prevention, intervention, and treatment to a 2 3 broad spectrum of clients; and 4 WHEREAS, it is vitally important that psychologists provide 5 6 the best possible service to their clients; and 7 8 WHEREAS, continuing education is essential to help psychologists maintain their professional competency and keep 9 abreast of the latest developments in their profession; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Hawaii is one of only six states that do not 12 require continuing education credits as part of their licensing 13 law for psychologists; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the American Psychological Association is a 16 membership organization that represents approximately 84,000 17 psychologists across the nation, and the Hawaii chapter 18 represents about three hundred psychologists across the State; 19 and 20 21 WHEREAS, the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs is 22 charged with protecting consumers through its regulatory and 23 licensing responsibilities; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs 26 and Hawaii Psychological Association are currently working 27 together on specific provisions to be included in a bill to 28 establish continuing education requirements for licensed 29 psychologists; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs 32 and Hawaii Psychological Association have also identified issues 33



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1	relevant to the requirement for continuing education for
.2	licensed psychologists, such as:
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4	(1) Ensuring that such requirements do not impose an undue
5	burden on psychologists in rural areas of Hawaii;
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7	(2) Using an established, widely recognized non-
8	governmental entity to approve continuing education
9 10	credits; and
10	(3) Ensuring that the program to implement and monitor
12	continuing education credits for licensed
13	psychologists is cost-neutral to the State; and
14	poychologico is cobe neutral to the state, and
15	WHEREAS, there are currently opportunities offered by
16	approved providers for continuing education statewide, including
17	in rural areas, such as in-person courses, webinars, and
18	teleconferences; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, continuing education opportunities should be made
21	available to members and non-members of the Hawaii Psychological
22	Association; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, the joint effort of the Department of Commerce and
25 26	Consumer Affairs and Hawaii Psychological Association is
26 27	critical in increasing and maintaining the professional competence of licensed psychologists in Hawaii through a
27 28	continuing education program; now, therefore,
28 29	continuing education program, now, chererore,
30	BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
31	Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
32	Session of 2013, that the Department of Commerce and Consumer
33	Affairs and Hawaii Psychological Association are urged to
34	continue collaborating on the issue of developing, implementing,
35	and monitoring continuing education requirements for all
36	licensed psychologists in Hawaii; and
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38	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no later than twenty days prior
39	to the Regular Session of 2014, the Department of Commerce and
40	Consumer Affairs and Hawaii Psychological Association are
41	requested to submit to the Legislature a proposed draft for a
42	bill to establish, implement, and monitor continuing education
43	requirements for all licensed psychologists in Hawaii; and
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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Commerce and
Consumer Affairs and President of the Hawaii Psychological
Association.
