WHEREAS, past group members include the talented Jerry Koko, Israel Kamakawiwoole, Skippy Kamakawiwoole, Louis Kauakahi, Abraham Nahulu, Melvin Amina, and Sam Gray; and

WHEREAS, the superb accomplishments and impressive performances of the MAKAHA SONS have allowed them to share their vibrant sounds and delightful stage presence with supporters for over 30 years; and

WHEREAS, in addition to appearing in movies and on talk shows, the MAKAHA SONS have traveled from Hawaii to Washington

D.C., as well as to Carnegie Hall, and have earned the privilege and honor of playing for both the President and Vice-President of the United States; and

WHEREAS, their undying efforts in perpetuating the Hawaiian culture through music have resulted in numerous proclamations and awards for the MAKAHA SONS, including countless "Na Hoku Hanohano Awards"; and
