## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO FUND ABORTIONS FOR SERVICEWOMEN IN CASES OF RAPE OR INCEST AND LIFT THE BAN ON PRIVATE FUNDING OF ABORTIONS AT MILITARY BASES.

WHEREAS, female military personnel have the same right to 1 basic health care services as their male counterparts, and 2 reproductive health care is a fundamental component of health 3 4 care for women; and 5 WHEREAS, the ban on privately funded abortions in military 6 facilities discriminates against women in the United States 7 military who have volunteered to serve their country and who 8 have been assigned to posts overseas; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the ban on privately funded abortions in military 11 facilities poses grave health risks and places an insurmountable 12 obstacle to access quality healthcare leaving servicewomen and 13 14 military dependents far worse off than civilian women; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in light of the tragically high incidence of rape 17 and sexual assault suffered by women in the military, servicewomen should not be further harmed by the denial of safe 18 abortion services; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the ban on abortions at military facilities 21 requires a woman to go to a private hospital or clinic, which 22 leaves the woman no choice but to use a local facility that may 23 be substandard or unsafe; and 24 25 WHEREAS, obtaining an abortion in a local hospital is 26 virtually impossible for many of the estimated 100,000 American 27 servicewomen in foreign countries, particularly in Afghanistan; 28 and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, the costs, time, and obvious risks involved in obtaining an abortion outside of military facilities prevent 32 some servicewomen and military dependents from obtaining the 33 health care they otherwise could have received; and 34



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1 2 WHEREAS, under current law, title 10 United States Code section 1093(a) provides that funds available to the Department 3 of Defense may be used to perform abortions only where the life 4 of the mother would be endangered if the fetus were carried to 5 6 term; and 7 WHEREAS, under title 10 United States Code section 1093(b), 8 Department of Defense medical facilities may be used to perform 9 abortions where the life of the mother would be endangered if 10 the fetus were carried to term or in a case in which the 11 pregnancy is the result of an act of rape or incest; and 12 13 WHEREAS, restricting the use of United States Department of 14 15 Defense funds for abortions to only those instances where the mother's life would be endangered risks the lives of many 16 servicewomen by forcing victims of rape or incest to personally 17 fund and contract for abortion procedures with foreign 18 physicians in many countries that lack medical personnel trained 19 to the standards of United States physicians; and 20 21 WHEREAS, providing military women serving overseas the same 22 access to basic health care, including safe abortions at 23 military facilities, is an issue of basic fairness; now, 24 therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 27 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 28 Session of 2013, that the United States Congress is requested 29 30 to: 31 (1)Recognize that over 365,000 women serve in the United 32 States Armed Forces and that more than 100,000 are 33 currently stationed and serving overseas; 34 35 (2) Express concern that at a time when the United States 36 is engaged in military actions on multiple fronts, and 37 servicewomen put their lives at risk to preserve 38 39 American rights and freedom, it is deeply troubling that American servicewomen are denied access to safe, 40 legal abortion when they serve abroad; and 41 42 Act to lift the ban on private funding of abortions at 43 (3) military bases; and 44



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2 (4) Amend section 1093(a) of title 10 United States Code 3 to allow funds available to the Department of Defense 4 to be used to perform abortions in cases in which a 5 pregnancy is the result of an act of rape or incest; 6 and 7

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 9 Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of the United 10 States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 11 Representatives, and to the members of Hawaii's congressional 12 delegation.
