HOUSE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII ADMINISTRATION TO ESTABLISH AND IMPLEMENT A TOBACCO-FREE UNIVERSITY POLICY FOR ALL UNIVERSITY CAMPUSES AND FACILITIES.

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 1 indicate that tobacco use is the single most preventable cause 2 of death in the United States, with tobacco-related diseases 3 4 resulting in \$96,000,000,000 in health care costs annually; and 5 WHEREAS, the 2012 United States Surgeon General's Report 6 states that tobacco use and exposure to second-hand smoke are 7 serious public health concerns and that there is no safe level 8 of exposure to environmental tobacco smoke; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the American College Health Association 11 acknowledges and supports the findings of the Surgeon General 12 that tobacco use in any form, active or passive, is a 13 significant health hazard on college campuses and should be 14 prohibited; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, on September 12, 2012, United States Assistant Secretary for Health, Dr. Howard Koh; University of Michigan 18 President, Mary Sue Coleman; and tobacco policy experts and 19 educational leaders announced the official kick-off of the 20 national Tobacco-Free College Campus Initiative at a symposium 21 at the University of Michigan School of Public Health; and 22 23 WHEREAS, according to a list created by the American 24 25 Nonsmokers' Rights Foundation, seven hundred sixty-six colleges and universities in the United States already prohibit smoking 26 and all forms of tobacco use everywhere on campus with no 27 exceptions, including the University of Arkansas, all 28 universities in the University of California system, the 29 University of Florida, the University of Guam, the University of 30 Kentucky, the University of Massachusetts - Amherst, the 31 University of Michigan, the University of Montana, the 32 University of North Dakota, all public universities in the state 33

of Oklahoma, and the University of Oregon, but not including any 1 institution of higher education in Hawaii; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, part of the mission of the University of Hawaii system is to "ensure the survival of present and future 5 generations with improvement in the quality of life"; and 6 7 WHEREAS, allowing smoking and tobacco use on University of 8 Hawaii campuses presents substantial fiscal burdens for employee 9 health care costs, absenteeism, turnover, physical facilities 10 upkeep, fire risks and losses, and litter control, and imposes 11 adverse impacts on the surrounding land and water environments 12 contrary to the University of Hawaii system's commitments and 13 core values concerning malama 'aina sustainability; and 14 15 WHEREAS, section 302A-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 16 17 prohibits the use of tobacco at all Hawaii public schools or at public functions at all times; and 18 19 WHEREAS, therefore, most students now attending the 20 University of Hawaii have graduated from schools where tobacco 21 use was prohibited and have come to expect tobacco-free 22 educational facilities as the norm; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Associated Students of the University of 25 Hawaii at Manoa passed Senate Resolution 05-12 in February 2012 26 27 calling upon the University of Hawaii at Manoa administration to prohibit smoking and all forms of tobacco use everywhere 28 throughout the University of Hawaii at Manoa campus, and the 29 Manoa Faculty Senate voted to support the Associated Students of 30 the University of Hawaii at Manoa Senate Resolution 05-12 in 31 March 2012; and 32 33 WHEREAS, in 2006, the Twenty-third Legislature of the State 34 of Hawaii passed a smoke-free workplaces law (Act 295, Session 35 Laws of Hawaii 2006), but the University of Hawaii's policy on 36 tobacco products, executive policy E10.102, was last updated 37 over ten years ago, prior to the enactment of that law and of 38 section 302A-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes (smoke-free public 39 schools); 40 41

42 WHEREAS, therefore, executive policy E10.102 not only 43 severely lags behind subsequent changes in state law, but also





behind community norms and attitudes with regards to tobacco 1 use; now, therefore, 2 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 5 Session of 2013, that University of Hawaii administration is 6 encouraged to take prompt action to prohibit smoking and the use 7 of any tobacco products by all persons including students, 8 faculty, staff, contractors, and visitors on all campuses and 9 campus facilities owned or operated by the University of Hawaii; 10 and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawaii 13 administration is requested to take prompt action to effectively 14 implement policies to make all University of Hawaii campuses 15 tobacco-free, including posting adequate signage clearly 16 notifying all persons of the University's tobacco-free policy 17 and carrying out a public information campaign to enable smooth 18 implementation; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the University of Hawaii 21 administration is encouraged to carry out the provisions of 22 executive policy E10.102(D), which calls upon university 23 administrators to create and implement meaningful plans to 24 discourage the initiation of tobacco product use and the 25 transition from occasional to nicotine-dependent tobacco product 26 use, and to assist the substantial number of tobacco product 27 users who are trying to quit; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 30 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the University of 31 Hawaii and the Chairperson of the Board of Regents of the 32 33 University of Hawaii. 34 35
