BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

8	immediately [to the department] by telephone [and by written

12	shall determine whether the department has jurisdiction over the
13	elder involved; and if not, shall notify the financial
14	institution, which shall then notify the proper local law
15	enforcement agency immediately by telephone and forward the
16	written report to the agency within three business days. A
17	financial institution shall not be liable for failing to report
18	suspected financial abuse to a local law enforcement agency in
19	cases in which the department fails to notify the institution of

21	practicably possible, and by written report sent within two
22	business days to the appropriate county police department

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1 [(d)] (c) Notwithstanding any other state law to the 2 contrary, including but not limited to laws concerning 3 confidentiality, any person, including [the] a financial institution, who: 4 Participates in the making of a report pursuant to 5 (1) 6 this section; and 7 (2) Believes, in good faith, that the action is warranted 8 by facts known to that person, 9 shall have immunity from any liability, civil or criminal, that 10 might be otherwise incurred or imposed by or as a result of the 11 making of the report. Any person making the report shall have 12 the same immunity with respect to participation in any judicial 13 proceeding resulting from the report. $[\frac{(e)}{(e)}]$ (d) For the purposes of this section: 14 15 ["Department" means the department of human services.] "Elder" means a person who is sixty-two years of age or **16** 17 older. 18 "Financial abuse" means [financial abuse or economic 19 exploitation.] to take, appropriate, obtain, or retain, or 20 assist in taking, appropriating, obtaining, or retaining, real

or personal property of an elder adult by any means, including

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- 1 undue influence, for a wrongful purpose or with intent to
- 2 defraud the elder adult."
