A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PAROLING AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 353-61, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) Members of the paroling authority shall be nominated
- 4 by a panel composed of the chief justice of the Hawaii supreme
- 5 court[τ] or designee, the director[τ] or designee, the president
- 6 of the Hawaii State Bar Association[7] or designee, a
- 7 representative designated by the head of the Interfaith Alliance
- 8 Hawaii, a member from the general public to be appointed by the
- 9 governor, and the president of the Hawaii chapter of the
- 10 National Association of Social Workers [-] or designee. The
- 11 panel shall submit to the governor the names of not less than
- 12 three persons, designated as the nominees, for chairperson or as
- 13 a member, for each vacancy. The requirement for nomination by
- 14 the panel established under this section shall only apply to a
- 15 nominee's nomination by the governor to an initial term on the
- 16 paroling authority and not to any subsequent consecutive term of
- 17 a sitting paroling authority member or chairperson whose initial

14		governor every three months;
15	[(3)]	(4) In promulgating rules, conform to chapter 91;
16	[(4)]	(5) [In all matters] Entitle a prisoner to a hearing
17		before a panel of three of its members, which shall
18	4	act by a majority of [its] the panel members; [and]
19	<u>(6)</u>	If it is determined immediately preceding or during
20		the course of a hearing that a sitting panel member

Report Title:

Hawaii Paroling Authority; Panel Members

Description:

Allows designees to be appointed to the panel that nominates members for the Hawaii Paroling Authority. Requires certain information regarding parole decisions by the Paroling Authority to be made public in a specified timeframe. Requires three Paroling Authority panel members for quorum, unless there is a recusal due to a conflict of interest, then only two panel members. Effective January 1, 2050. (SB1176 HD1)
