# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ASSET FORFEITURE.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 712A-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3           "**§712A-4 Covered offenses.** Offenses for which property is  
4 subject to forfeiture under this chapter are:

5           (a) All offenses that specifically authorize forfeiture;

6           (b) Murder, kidnapping, labor trafficking, gambling,  
7 criminal property damage, robbery, bribery, extortion,  
8 theft, unauthorized entry into motor vehicle,

9 burglary, money laundering, trademark counterfeiting,

10 insurance fraud, promoting a dangerous, harmful, or

11 detrimental drug, commercial promotion of marijuana,

12 methamphetamine trafficking, manufacturing of a

13 controlled substance with a child present, promoting

14 child abuse, or electronic enticement of a child that

15 is chargeable as a felony offense under state law;

16           (c) The manufacture, sale, or distribution of a controlled

17 substance in violation of chapter 329, promoting

18 detrimental drugs or intoxicating compounds, promoting



1           pornography, promoting pornography for minors, or  
2           promoting prostitution, which is chargeable as a  
3           felony or misdemeanor offense [~~, but not as a petty~~  
4           ~~misdemeanor,~~] under state law; [and]

5           (d) The attempt, conspiracy, solicitation, coercion, or  
6           intimidation of another to commit any offense for  
7           which property is subject to forfeiture [~~-~~]; and

8           (e) Any violation of laws or rules that is charged as a  
9           petty misdemeanor."

10           SECTION 2. Section 712A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
11 amended by amending subsection (2) to read as follows:

12           "(2) Except that:

13           ~~[(a) Real property, or an interest therein, may be~~  
14           ~~forfeited under the provisions of this chapter only in~~  
15           ~~eases in which the covered offense is chargeable as a~~  
16           ~~felony offense under state law;~~

17           ~~(b)]~~ (a) No property shall be forfeited under this chapter  
18           to the extent of an interest of an owner, by reason of  
19           any act or omission established by that owner to have  
20           been committed or omitted without the knowledge and  
21           consent of that owner;

1     ~~(e)~~     **(b)** No conveyance used by any person as a common  
2                   carrier in the transaction of a business as a common  
3                   carrier is subject to forfeiture under this section  
4                   unless it appears that the owner or other person in  
5                   charge of the conveyance is a consenting party or  
6                   privy to a violation of this chapter;

7     ~~(d)~~     **(c)** No conveyance is subject to forfeiture under this  
8                   section by reason of any act or omission established  
9                   by the owner thereof to have been committed or omitted  
10                  without the owner's knowledge or consent; and

11    ~~(e)~~     **(d)** A forfeiture of a conveyance encumbered by a bona  
12                  fide security interest is subject to the interest of  
13                  the secured party if the secured party neither had  
14                  knowledge of nor consented to the act or omission."

15               SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that  
16               matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were  
17               begun before its effective date.

18               SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
19               and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.


