A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that concerns have been
- 2 raised as to whether the research corporation of the University
- 3 of Hawaii and its board of directors have been given a broader
- 4 range of authority and flexibility than originally intended.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to clarify the role of the
- 6 research corporation of the University of Hawaii and its board
- 7 of directors, as well as the relationship between the board of
- 8 directors and the University of Hawaii system.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 304A-3002, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]\$304A-3002[+] Board of directors; composition. The
- 12 affairs of the research corporation shall be under the general
- 13 management and control of the board of directors. The board of
- 14 directors shall consist of [ten] eight members. [Five] Two
- 15 members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii,
- 16 selected by the board of regents, shall be members of the board
- 17 of directors for terms to be determined by the board of regents;

1	provided that no term shall extend beyond the term as a member		
2	of the board of regents. [The remaining five] Five members		
3	shall be appointed by the governor pursuant to section 26-34[-];		
4	provided that:		
5	(1) One member shall be a University of Hawaii system		
6	research faculty member;		
7	(2) One member shall be from the business sector;		
8	(3) One member shall be a representative of a non-		
9	University of Hawaii research organization; and		
0	(4) Two members shall be from the general public.		
1	All the members appointed by the governor shall serve for a		
12	term of four years, except that the governor may reduce the		
13	terms of those initially appointed so as to provide, as nearly		
14	as can be, for the expiration of an equal number of terms at		
15	intervals of one year, each term commencing on July 1 and		
16	expiring on June 30. The vice president for research of the		
17	University of Hawaii system shall be a non-voting ex officio		
18	member of the board of directors. All members of the board of		
19	directors shall serve without pay, but shall be entitled to		
20	reimbursement for necessary expenses while attending meetings		
) 1	and while in the diagharge of duties and responsibilities		

1	The	members of the board of directors shall elect the	
2	chairperson of the board."		
3	SECTION 3. Section 304A-3005, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended to read as follows:		
5	"[+]\$304A-3005[+] Research corporation excepted from		
6	certain s	state laws. To carry out the purposes and objectives of	
7	the research corporation, including the conduct of research and		
8	training projects, the research corporation shall be granted		
9	flexibility in hiring its personnel and in handling and		
10	disbursing moneys by being excepted from the following state		
11	laws:		
12	(1)	Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund	
13		reimbursements to the state general fund;	
14	(2)	Chapter 103D, relating to advertising for bids and	
15		purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever public moneys	
16		are expended; provided that the exemption shall not	
17		apply to construction contracts for which the total	
18		estimated value of state funds to be used is	
. 19		\$ or more;	
20	(3)	Chapter 76, relating to civil service; and	
21	(4)	Section 78-1, relating to public employment."	

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         SECTION 4. Section 304A-3006, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
         "[+]$304A-3006[+] Officers and employees of the research
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    corporation. [The president of the university shall be the
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    president of the research corporation.] The board of directors
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    shall employ an executive director of the research corporation
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    who shall serve at the pleasure of the board of directors. The
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    executive director's salary shall not be more than two times
    greater than the salary of the highest paid head of a department
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    within the executive branch. The board of directors may also
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    appoint such other officers and employees as may be necessary in
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    administering the affairs of the research corporation.
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    board of directors shall set the employees' duties,
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    responsibilities, salaries, holidays, vacations, leaves, hours
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    of work, and working conditions. The board of directors may
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    grant such other benefits to its employees as it deems
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    necessary. Employees of the research corporation shall not be
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    entitled to any benefits conferred under chapter 76 relating to
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    civil service, chapter 78 relating to public service, chapter 88
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    relating to pension and retirement systems, and the appropriate
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    collective bargaining agreement, executive order, executive
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    directive, or rule."
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- 1 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii; University of Hawaii Board of Regents; Procurement; Board of Directors

Description:

Reduces the number of members of the board of directors of the research corporation of the University of Hawaii from ten to eight members. Reduces the number of members of the board of regents who must be members of the board of directors from five Specifies the qualifications of the five members to be selected by the governor. Adds the vice president for research of the University of Hawaii system as an ex officio member of the board of directors. Amends section 304A-3005, HRS, to provide that the research corporation's exemption from the procurement requirements of chapter 103D, HRS, shall not apply to construction contracts for which the estimated value of state funds to be used is an unspecified dollar amount or more. Removes the university president's authority to serve as the president of the research corporation. Authorizes the board of directors to employ an executive director of the research corporation. Caps the executive director's salary at twice the salary of the highest paid head of a department within the executive branch. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
