## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§712-Solicitation of a minor for prostitution. (1) A 5 person eighteen years of age or older commits the offense of 6 solicitation of a minor for prostitution if the person offers or 7 agrees to pay a fee to a minor to engage in sexual conduct. 8 (2) Solicitation of a minor for prostitution is a class C 9 felony. 10 (3) For purposes of this section: 11 "Minor" means a person who is less than eighteen years of **12** age. "Sexual conduct" has the same meaning as in section 712-1200(2)."

## Report Title:

Prostitution; Minors; Offenses; Statute of Limitations; Forfeiture; Sex Offender Registry

## Description:

Makes solicitation of a minor for prostitution a crime. Adds the offenses of solicitation of a minor for prostitution, habitual solicitation of prostitution, and solicitation of prostitution near schools and public parks to the State's forfeiture laws. Requires registration with the sexual offender registry for conviction of solicitation of a minor for prostitution as a tier 1 offense. (SB192 HD1)
