
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that of cancers affecting
2 men and women, cancer of the colon and rectum, also known as
3 colorectal cancer, is the second leading killer in the United
4 States. According to the National Cancer Institute, in 2007,
5 142,627 people in the United States were diagnosed with, and
6 53,219 people died from, colorectal cancer. Based on rates from
7 2006 through 2008, 5.08 per cent of men and women born today
8 will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer during their lifetime.
9 Since colorectal cancer almost always develops from precancerous
10 polyps in the colon or rectum, screening tests are an easy and
11 effective method to find precancerous polyps and detect
12 colorectal cancer in its early stages.

13 The legislature also finds that a screening program will
14 increase detections of any cancer at an early state, which in
15 turn improves chances for survival and decreases mortality
16 rates. With the success of the Hawaii comprehensive breast and
17 cervical cancer control program, established by the legislature
18 in 1997 to provide breast and cervical cancer screening, the



1 legislature further finds that this program is a model of an
2 effective approach to increasing the number of screenings and
3 early detection of colorectal cancer.

4 The purpose of this Act is to:

5 (1) Establish a two-year Hawaii colorectal cancer
6 screening awareness pilot program using the Hawaii
7 comprehensive breast and cervical cancer control
8 program as a model; and

9 (2) Appropriate funds for the pilot program.

10 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Hawaii colorectal
11 cancer screening awareness pilot program, to be administered by
12 the department of health in collaboration with the department of
13 human services, to facilitate the early detection of colorectal
14 cancer and to assist individuals who have been diagnosed with
15 colorectal cancer.

16 (b) Under the Hawaii colorectal cancer screening awareness
17 program, the department of health shall:

18 (1) Educate, train, and improve the skills of health care
19 professionals, including allied health professionals
20 and lay health educators, in the detection and
21 management of colorectal cancer through the
22 professionals' participation in the pilot program;



- 1 (2) Educate women and men regarding the risks associated
- 2 with colorectal cancer and the benefits of screening;
- 3 (3) Provide outreach to individuals who are at greater
- 4 risk for colorectal cancer; and
- 5 (4) Provide referral services for individuals diagnosed
- 6 with colorectal cancer.

7 (c) The department of health shall submit a report to the
8 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
9 the 2014 through 2016 regular sessions on the expenditure of all
10 funds for the Hawaii colorectal cancer screening awareness pilot
11 program.

12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
15 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
16 year 2014-2015 for the Hawaii colorectal cancer screening
17 awareness pilot program.

18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
19 of health for the purposes of this Act.

20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and
21 shall be repealed on June 30, 2015.
