### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL LANDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. 1 The legislature finds that one of the major 2 educational dilemmas of our time is rooted in an existing system 3 that traps information-age students in agricultural-age schools. 4 While the flow of information and ideas is increasingly fluid, 5 students are confined to the physical structures and mindsets of 6 an earlier time and place. Building, repairing, and 7 retrofitting public schools to meet the challenges of the 8 twenty-first century and beyond will not be easy, and the costs 9 will be considerable. However, quality school infrastructure 10 facilitates an environment that will prepare children to achieve 11 and succeed in a highly competitive economy. 12 The infrastructure of the twenty-first century school must 13 be energy efficient and wired with the latest technology. 14 Classroom size must be flexible because the program, not the space, should determine the number of students per class. 15 16 school campus must be designed from its inception with student

         The legislature further finds that twenty-first century

    schools are also those that include a full complement of the

    people, programs, and places that support a wide range of

    are often separated from personal and family service programs in

    urban and rural communities. One way to address this situation

    is to think about schools as the center of a community that can
    support all aspects of living and learning. The creation of

    school-centered communities will provide greater access to

    centrally located physical, cultural, social, economic,

    organizational, and educational programs and services that are
    within walking distance of children and families.

         The considerable amount of underused public school lands on
15
    the State's two hundred fifty-seven school campuses is an

    untapped resource that would provide infrastructure that could

    make classrooms, campuses, and communities suitable for the

    twenty-first century. By way of illustration, a preliminary

    review by a real estate expert indicates that ten parcels that
    have unused lands are valued at $120,000,000 under existing

1 benefit of Hawaii's public school children. The beneficiaries 2 would be the children of Hawaii. The purpose of this Act is to optimize the use of public 3 4 school lands to generate opportunities to improve public school 5 facilities and infrastructure to meet the challenges of the 6 twenty-first century and to improve the overall quality of 7 education in Hawaii. In particular, this Act establishes a 8 three-year pilot project to generate revenue from uses for 9 public purposes, such as workforce housing, to build and 10 retrofit twenty-first century schools and create more school-11 centered communities. The pilot project will lay important groundwork for a statewide approach and plan to optimize public 12 13 school lands and modernize public school facilities. This Act 14 also establishes the school facilities special fund within chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, into which shall be 15 deposited all proceeds generated from the lease of public school 16 lands. Moneys in the school facilities special fund will be 17 18 used to build or upgrade twenty-first century school facilities. SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19

#### Report Title:

Education; Public School Lands; Leases; Appropriation

### Description:

Establishes a three-year pilot program to generate revenue for the use of public school land. Specifies that the lieutenant governor, in consultation with the department of education, board of education, and other appropriate agencies, shall be the facilitator of the pilot program. Authorizes the lease of certain public school lands for public purposes, including but not limited to the development of workforce housing rental units, under specified conditions. Establishes the school facilities special fund within chapter 302A, HRS. Repeals the schools facilities special fund in chapter 171C, HRS. Requires the lieutenant governor to submit a report to the legislature. Makes an appropriation for the pilot program. Pilot program repeals 6/30/2016.
