A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ISLAND BURIAL COUNCILS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the statute
2	providing for the establishment of the island burial councils
3	needs to be clarified and simplified to ensure that the island
4	burial councils can fulfill their critical responsibilities.
5	SECTION 2. Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§6E-43.5 Island burial councils; creation; appointment;
8	composition; duties. (a) [The department shall establish]
9	There are established within the department five island burial
10	councils, one each for [Hawaii, Maui/Lanai, Molokai, Óahu, and
11	Kauai/Niihau, Hawai'i, Maui/Lāna'i, Moloka'i, O'ahu, and
12	Kaua'i/Ni'ihau, to implement section 6E-43. Each council shall
13	consist of nine members, except the Moloka'i council, which shall
14	consist of five members. Each council shall consist of no more
15	than three representatives of development and large land owner
16	interests; provided that the Moloka'i council shall consist of no

more than one representative of development and large property

1	owner int	erests. The remaining council members shall represent
2	the geogr	aphic regions identified in paragraphs (1) through (5).
3	At all ti	mes, at least two of the regional representatives of
4	each coun	cil shall have been appointed from a list of nominees
5	submitted	to the governor by the office of Hawaiian affairs, as
6	provided	under subsection (b). Each council shall include at
7	least one	representative from each geographic region identified
8	as follow	s:
9	(1)	The Hawai'i council shall include the following
10		geographic regions: Kohala, Kona, Kaʻū, Puna, Hilo,
11		and Hāmākua;
12	(2)	The Maui/Lāna'i council shall include the following
13		geographic regions: Honua'ula, Lahaina, Wailuku,
14		Makawao, Hāna, and Lāna'i;
15	(3)	The Moloka'i council shall include the following
16		geographic regions: West Moloka'i, Central Moloka'i,
17		East Moloka'i, and Kalawao;
18	(4)	The O'ahu council shall include the following
19	<u> </u>	geographic regions: Wai'anae, 'Ewa, Kona, Ko'olaupoko,
17		geographic regrous. war anae, Ewa, Kona, Ko Oraupoko,
20		Koʻolauloa, and Waialua; and

T	(5) The Kaua'i/Ni'ihau council shall include the following
2	geographic regions: Waimea/Na Pali, Kōloa, Līhu'e,
3	Kawaihau, Hanalei, and Ni'ihau.
4	Regional representatives shall be selected from the Hawaiian
5	community on the basis of the representatives' understanding of
6	the culture, history, burial beliefs, customs, and practices of
7	native Hawaiians.
8	(b) Appointment of members to the councils shall be made
9	by the governor, in accordance with section 26-34[-] and
10	subsection (a), from [a list provided] lists for each council
11	submitted by the department[, provided that a minimum of twenty
12	per cent of the regional representatives shall be appointed from
13	a list of at least nine candidates provided by the office of
14	Hawaiian affairs. The department shall develop the list in
15	consultation with appropriate Hawaiian organizations, such as
16	Hui Malama I Na Kupuna O Hawai'i Nei. The membership of each
17	council shall include at least one representative from each
18	geographic region of the island as well as representatives of
19	development and large property owner interests. Regional
20	representatives shall be selected from the Hawaiian community on
21	the basis of their understanding of the culture, history, burial
22	beliefs, customs, and practices of native Hawaiians. The

1	councils	shall have a minimum of nine and a maximum of fifteen
2	members,	and have a ratio of not more than three to one and no
3	less than	two to one in favor of regional representatives. and
4	the offic	e of Hawaiian affairs. Lists to fill vacancies on the
5	councils	shall be submitted as follows:
6	(1)	For vacancies attributable to the expiration of terms,
7		the list shall be submitted on the first business day
8		of December prior to the expiration of the terms.
9		Each list submitted by the department and by the
10		office of Hawaiian affairs for any council shall
11		include enough names to permit the governor to fill
12		the last vacant seat on the council with one of at
13		least two listed individuals qualified to fill the
14		vacancy; and
15	(2)	For a vacancy that occurs during a council
16		representative's term, the list shall be submitted
17		within thirty business days after the vacancy occurs,
18		except as provided in subsection (c). Each list shall
19		include at least two individuals qualified to fill
20		each vacancy.
21	<u>(c)</u>	The department may submit any list to fill a vacancy
22	up to fif	teen days after the office of Hawaiian affairs submits

- 1 its list for the same vacancy; provided that the failure of the
- 2 department to submit any list by any relevant deadline or
- 3 fifteen days after the office of Hawaiian affairs submits its
- 4 list, whichever occurs later, shall be construed as a waiver of
- 5 the department's right to submit a list.
- 6 [(c)] (d) The department, in consultation with the
- 7 councils, office of Hawaiian affairs, representatives of
- 8 development and large [property] land owner interests, and
- 9 appropriate Hawaiian organizations, such as Hui Malama I Na
- 10 Kupuna O Hawai'i Nei, shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
- 11 necessary to carry out the purposes of this section. The
- 12 council members shall serve without compensation, but shall be
- 13 reimbursed for necessary expenses incurred during the
- 14 performance of their duties. The councils shall be a part of
- 15 the department for administrative purposes.
- 16 [\(\frac{(d)}{d}\)] (e) The councils shall hold meetings and acquire
- 17 information as they deem necessary and shall communicate their
- 18 findings and recommendations to the department. Notwithstanding
- 19 section 92-3, whenever the location and description of burial
- 20 sites are under consideration, the councils may hold closed
- 21 meetings. A majority of all members to which each council is
- 22 entitled shall constitute a quorum to do business. Concurrence



- 1 of a majority of the members present at a meeting shall be
- 2 necessary to make any action of a council valid.
- 3 [(e)] (f) Department records relating to the location and
- 4 description of historic sites, including burial sites, if deemed
- 5 sensitive by a council or the [Hawaii] Hawaii historic places
- 6 review board, shall be confidential.
- 7 $\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ (g) The councils shall:
- 8 (1) Determine the preservation or relocation of previously
 9 identified native Hawaiian burial sites;
- (2) Assist the department in the inventory andidentification of native Hawaiian burial sites;
- 12 (3) Make recommendations regarding appropriate management,
 13 treatment, and protection of native Hawaiian burial
 14 sites, and on any other matters relating to native
 15 Hawaiian burial sites;
- (4) Elect a chairperson for a four-year term who shallserve for not more than two consecutive terms; and
- (5) Maintain a list of appropriate Hawaiian organizations,
 agencies, and offices to notify regarding the
 discovery of remains."
- 21 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the amendments made by this Act
- 22 to section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, each current

- 3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
