A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The purpose of this Act is to reestablish the 1 2 governor's authority to nominate and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appoint the members of the board of 3 4 regents of the University of Hawaii by repealing the candidate 5 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of 6 Hawaii; provided that this Act shall be implemented upon 7 ratification of the constitutional amendment to article X, 8 section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution, which would delete 9 provisions related to the regents candidate advisory council. 10 It is the intent of the legislature that the existing 11 members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii serve their full terms of office. As each term expires, the 12 13 regent shall be replaced by a member nominated and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. 14 15 SECTION 2. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "\$304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications;

1 general management and control of the board of regents 2 consisting of fifteen members who shall be appointed and may be 3 removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by law, 4 state officers shall be eliqible for appointment and membership. 5 The term of each member shall be five years, except as provided for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided that the 6 7 term of the student member shall be two years. Every member may 8 serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term of 9 appointment until the member's successor has been appointed by 10 the governor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with 11 article X, section 6 of the Hawaii Constitution. Members shall 12 serve no more than two consecutive five-year terms; provided 13 that the members who are initially appointed to terms of two 14 years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be reappointed to 15 two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to be appointed to a second term of five years, the senate shall consider the 16 17 question of whether to reconfirm the member at least one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of a member's first five-18 19 year term; provided that if the senate is not in session within one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of the member's 20 21 first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until

the senate convenes for the next regular session or the next

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- 1 special session for which the senate is authorized to consider
- 2 the question of reconfirmation.
- 3 (b) [At a meeting preceding July 1 of each year, the board
- 4 of regents shall elect a chairperson and up to two vice-
- 5 chairpersons whose terms shall be from July 1 to June 30 of the
- 6 next year or thereafter until their successors are elected.] At
- 7 its first meeting after June 30, the board shall elect a
- 8 chairperson and a vice-chairperson who shall serve until
- 9 adjournment of the board's first meeting after June 30 of the
- 10 next year or thereafter until their successors are appointed.
- 11 The board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member
- 12 of the board. The president of the university shall act as
- 13 executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of
- 14 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the
- 15 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board
- 16 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of
- 17 the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten
- 18 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
- 19 counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.
- 20 [(c) The governor shall notify the regents candidate
- 21 advisory council in writing within ten days of receiving

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    notification that a member of the board of regents is resigning,
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    has died, or is being removed by the governor.
         (d) (c) The members of the board of regents shall serve
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    without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
    within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
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    actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."
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         SECTION 3. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
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         ["$304A-104.5 Regents candidate advisory council for the
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    board of regents of the University of Hawaii. (a) There is
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    established the regents candidate advisory council for the board
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    of regents of the University of Hawaii to present to the
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    governor pools of qualified candidates from which the members of
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    the board of regents shall be nominated and, by and with the
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    consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The regents
    candidate advisory council shall establish the criteria for
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    qualifying, screening, and presenting to the governor candidates
    for membership on the board of regents. The regents candidate
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    advisory council shall be attached to the University of Hawaii
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    for administrative purposes.
         (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), the regents
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    candidate advisory council shall present no fewer than two and
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1	no more t	han four qualified candidates for each seat on the
2	board of	regents to the governor within:
3	(1)	Sixty days of a vacancy that arises by resignation,
4		death, or removal by the governor; or
5	(2)	One hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of a
6		term.
7	The regen	ts candidate advisory council shall be deemed to have
8	fulfilled	its obligation under this section upon presentation of
9	the names	of the minimum number of candidates required to be
10	presented	for each seat or seats on the board of regents.
11	(e)	When there are multiple seats vacant within the same
12	county or	within the at-large membership, the regents candidate
13	advisory	council shall present candidates for seats on the board
14	of regent	s to the governor as follows:
15	(1)	For two seats from the same county or two at-large
16		seats, no fewer than four and no more than six
17		candidates;
18	(2)	For three seats from the same county, no fewer than
19		five and no more than eight candidates; and
20	(3)	For more than three seats, the regents candidate
21		advisory council shall determine appropriate minimum
22		numbers of candidates, which shall provide for at



1		least three candidates for the final seat, and maximum
2		numbers of candidates.
3	(d)	In making its presentations, the regents candidate
4	advisory	council shall:
5	(1)	Develop a statement that includes the selection
6		criteria to be applied and a description of the
7		responsibilities and duties of a member of the board
8		of regents and distribute this statement to potential
9		candidates;
10	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
11		board of regents based on their background,
12		experience, and potential for discharging the
13		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;
14	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
15		solicit and accept applications from potential
16		candidates;
17	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
18		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
19		serve on the board of regents;
20	(5)	Ensure student involvement by establishing a student
21		advisory group composed of:

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1		(A)	The senior student affairs officer of the
2			University of Hawaii system;
3		(B)	No fewer than three student representatives from
4			the University of Hawaii student caucus who shall
5			represent, to the maximum extent possible, the
6			interests of the various University of Hawaii
7			campuses on each island; and
8		(C) -	No fewer than three student life advisors who
9			shall represent, to the maximum extent possible,
10			the interests of the various University of Hawaii
11			campuses on each island,
12		who-	shall work with and assist the regents candidate
13		advi	sory council to recruit and evaluate candidates
14		for	the student member of the board of regents and
15		make	recommendations to the regents candidate advisory
16		coun	cil based on the qualifications of the candidates
17		appl	ying for the position; and
18	(6)	Requ	ire each candidate to disclose any existing or
19		anti	cipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or
20		any-	existing or anticipated financial transactions
21		with	the University of Hawaii.

1	Upon subm	rission of the names of candidates to the governor, the
2	regents c	andidate advisory council shall make available the
3	names of	candidates to the public through the University of
4	Hawaii.	
5	-(e)	For each board-seat to be filled, the governor shall
6	select on	e nominee from among the candidates submitted by the
7	regents c	andidate advisory council.
8	(f)	The regents candidate advisory council shall consist
9	of seven	members to be appointed without regard to section 26-34
10	as follow	r s:
11	(1)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
12		senate;
13	(2)	One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the
14		house of representatives;
15	(3)	One member shall be appointed by the governor;
16	(4)	One member shall be appointed by one of the co-chairs
17		of the All Campus Council of Faculty Senate Chairs of
18		the University of Hawaii. A person may not be
19		appointed as a member of the regents candidate
20		advisory council under this paragraph, if within the
21		five years immediately preceding that appointment, the

1		person served on the All Campus Council of Faculty
2		Senate Chairs of the University of Hawaii;
3	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
4		the Executive Council of the University of Hawaii
5		Student Caucus. A person may not be appointed as a
6		member of the regents candidate advisory council under
7		this paragraph, if within one year immediately
8		preceding that appointment, the person served on the
9		Executive Council of the University of Hawaii Student
10		Caucus;
11	(6)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
12		the Association of Emeritus Regents; and
13	(7)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
14		University of Hawaii Alumni Association;
15	provided	that members appointed under paragraphs (4) to (7)
16	shall be	selected from the general public and may include
17	members o	f the constituencies represented; provided further that
18	each appo	intee satisfies the requirements for appointment
19	provided	in this subsection.
20	The	regents candidate advisory council shall be selected in
21	a wholly	nonpartisan manner. Appointees to the regents
22	candidate	advisory council shall have a general understanding of
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- 1 the purposes of higher education, the mission of the University 2 of Hawaii system, and the responsibilities of the board of 3 regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed as having placed the broad public interest ahead of special 4 interests, having achieved a high level of prominence in their 5 6 respective professions, and being respected members of the 7 community. 8 (g) Members of the regents candidate advisory council 9 shall serve four year terms; provided that the three members 10 initially appointed by the governor, the president of the 11 senate, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall 12 serve for terms of two years. 13 (h) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in 14 the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the 15 person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy 16 shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's 17 predecessor. 18 (i) The regents candidate advisory council shall operate in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member 19 20 of the regents candidate advisory council, shall run for or hold 21 any elected office under the United States or the State or any
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of its political subdivisions.

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1	(j) The members of the regents candidate advisory council
2	shall choose a chairperson from among themselves. A majority of
3	all the members to which the regents candidate advisory council
4	is entitled shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. The
5	concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the
6	regents candidate advisory council is entitled shall be
7	necessary to make any action of the regents candidate advisory
8	council valid. The regents candidate advisory council shall
9	meet annually and at other times as necessary. The regents
10	candidate advisory council shall be exempt from part I of
11	chapter 92.
12	(k) Members of the regents candidate advisory council
13	shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
14	expenses, including travel, board, and lodging expenses,
15	necessary for the performance of their duties.
16	(1) Notwithstanding chapter 92F or any other law to the
17	contrary, all information required by the regents candidate
18	advisory council shall be confidential, including without
19	limitation, all council information obtained, reviewed, or
20	considered before and after council decisionmaking.
21	Confidential regents candidate advisory council information
22	shall include documents, data, or other information that are not
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of public record, including without limitation, personal 1 2 financial information; the names of applicants; applications and the personal, financial, and other information contained therein 3 submitted by the applicants to the regents candidate advisory 4 council; interviews; schedules; reports; studies; background 5 checks; credit reports; surveys and reports prepared for or on 6 the regents candidate advisory council's behalf; the results of 7 8 any evaluations or assessments conducted by the regents candidate advisory council; the substance and details of any 9 discussions with regents candidate advisory council members; and 10 the substance and details of discussions and deliberations of 11 the regents candidate advisory council and any of its committees 12 13 during meetings."] SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the 14 existing members of the board of regents of the University of 15 Hawaii who are serving on the effective date of this Act shall 16 continue to serve their full terms of office. expires, each regent shall be replaced by a member nominated

and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the

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governor pursuant to this Act.

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1	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon the
2	ratification of a constitutional amendment repealing the
3	requirement that the governor make appointments to the board of
4	regents of the University of Hawaii from pools of qualified
5	candidates presented to the governor by the candidate advisory
6	council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii in
7	compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
8	the State of Hawaii.

Description:

Reestablishes the governor's authority to nominate and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appoint the members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii by repealing the candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii; effective upon ratification of an amendment to article X, section 6, of the Hawaii Constitution that repeals provisions related to the regents candidate advisory council. Authorizes the board to elect one vice-chairperson, rather than up to two vice-chairpersons. Amends the timing of election and term dates of the board chairperson and vice-chairperson. (SD2)

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
