## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while the candidate
- 2 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
- 3 Hawaii has nominated many outstanding appointees to the board,
- 4 important concerns have been raised as to the selection process.
- 5 Since the passage of Act 56, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, to
- 6 implement the amendments to article X, section 6 of the state
- 7 constitution, a number of issues have arisen from the new method
- $oldsymbol{8}$  of regent selection that hampered the work of the regents
- 9 candidate advisory council and led to questions regarding the
- 10 final selection of appointees during the senate confirmation
- 11 process.
- 12 The legislature further finds that on August 29, 2012,
- 13 pursuant to senate rule 20, the senate president appointed a
- 14 senate special committee on accountability to conduct
- 15 informational briefings to review the oversight, accountability,
- 16 and transparency of the operational and financial management of
- 17 the University of Hawaii system, including but not limited to
- 18 the University of Hawaii's athletic department.



- 1 During the informational briefings, the committee focused 2 on, among other things, the oversight and transparency of the University's fiscal and operational administration, including 3 4 the role of the board of regents. The informational briefings reaffirmed the importance of granting the governor the authority 5 to select and appoint regents on the basis of how each regent's 6 individual strengths will add to and complement the overall 7 8 quality of the board of regents. It has become clear that the governor will not be able to adequately select nominees to the 9 board of regents unless the governor has more control and 10 involvement in the recruitment and selection process. 11 12 legislature believes that it is appropriate to reassess and seriously consider making significant changes to the form and 13 function of the regents candidate advisory council. 14 The purpose of this Act is to reconstitute the form and 15 16 processes of the candidate advisory council to maximize the governor's ability to appoint qualified individuals to serve as 17 members of the board of regents and effectively lead the 18 19 University of Hawaii. SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 21

and to read as follows:

9	board of	regents within:
10	(1)	Thirty days of a vacancy; or
11	(2)	At least one hundred twenty days prior to the
12		expiration of a regent's term.
13	(d)	To provide continuity for the board of regents, the
14	governor	may recommend to the candidate advisory council the
15	reappoint	ment of a board of regents member, subject to senate
16	confirmat	ion.
17	<u>(e)</u>	The candidate advisory council shall consist of five
18	members,	to be appointed by the governor without regard to
19	section 2	6-34, and one non-voting ex officio member who shall be
20	the most	recent emeritus chair of the board of regents.
21	Appointee	s to the candidate advisory council shall have a
22	general u	nderstanding of the purposes of higher education, the

- 1 mission and strategic goals of the University of Hawaii system,
- 2 and the role and responsibilities of the board of regents.
- 3 Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed as having
- 4 placed the broad public interest ahead of special interests, who
- 5 are respected by the community, and who are highly qualified to
- 6 recruit and rate candidates for the governor's consideration.
- 7 (f) Each member of the candidate advisory council shall
- 8 serve for the duration of the term of the governor by whom the
- 9 member was appointed.
- 10 (q) The candidate advisory council shall operate in a
- 11 wholly nonpartisan manner. No member of the candidate advisory
- 12 council shall run for or hold any elected office of the State or
- 13 its political subdivisions. Any member of the candidate
- 14 advisory council shall resign from the candidate advisory
- 15 council prior to filing nomination papers for an elected office
- 16 of the State or its political subdivisions.
- 17 (h) The governor shall appoint the chairperson of the
- 18 candidate advisory council. A majority of the members to which
- 19 the candidate advisory council is entitled shall constitute a
- 20 quorum to do business. The concurrence of a majority of all the
- 21 members to which the candidate advisory council is entitled

         SECTION 3. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    amended to read as follows:

    general management and control of the board of regents
    [consisting]. The board shall consist of fifteen members who

    shall be appointed [and] by the governor from lists of qualified

    candidates at any time during the nomination and confirmation

- 3 Every member may serve beyond the expiration date of the
- 4 member's term of appointment until the member's successor has
- 5 been appointed by the governor and confirmed by the senate in
- 6 accordance with article X, section 6 of the Hawaii constitution.
- 7 Members shall serve no more than two consecutive five-year
- 8 terms; provided that the members who are initially appointed to
- 9 terms of two years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be
- 10 reappointed to two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to
- 11 be appointed to a second term of five years, the senate shall
- 12 consider the question of whether to reconfirm the member at
- 13 least one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of a
- 14 member's first five-year term; provided that if the senate is
- 15 not in session within one hundred twenty days prior to the
- 16 conclusion of the member's first five-year term, the member
- 17 shall continue to serve until the senate convenes for the next
- 18 regular session or the next special session for which the senate
- 19 is authorized to consider the question of reconfirmation.
- (b) In determining whether to confirm the governor's
- 21 nominee to the board of regents, the senate shall consider the
- 22 combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and



- 1 characteristics of the board of regents, as a whole, that will
- 2 best serve the diverse interests and needs of the students of
- 3 the university system and assist the university system in
- 4 achieving its strategic goals and performance indicators. The
- 5 senate shall consider such factors as whether the board reflects
- 6 the diversity of the student population, the various counties of
- 7 the State, and a broad representation of higher education-
- 8 related stakeholders.
- 9 [\(\(\frac{(b)}{}\)] (c) At a meeting preceding July 1 of each year, the
- 10 board of regents shall elect a chairperson and up to two vice-
- 11 chairpersons whose terms shall be from July 1 to June 30 of the
- 12 next year or thereafter until their successors are elected. The
- 13 board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of
- 14 the board. The president of the university shall act as
- 15 executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of
- 16 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the
- 17 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board
- 18 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of
- 19 the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten
- 20 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
- 21 counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.
