A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while the candidate
- 2 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
- 3 Hawaii has nominated many outstanding appointees to the board,
- 4 important concerns have been raised as to the selection process.
- 5 Since the passage of Act 56, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, to
- 6 implement the amendments to article X, section 6, of the Hawaii
- 7 state constitution, a number of issues have arisen from this new
- 8 method of regent selection, which has hampered the work of the
- 9 regents candidate advisory council and led to questions about
- 10 the final selection of appointees during the senate confirmation
- 11 process.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to reconstitute the form and
- 13 processes of the candidate advisory council to increase the
- 14 appointment of qualified individuals to serve as members of the
- 15 board of regents and effectively lead the University of Hawaii.
- 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 18 and to read as follows:

7	<u>(b)</u>	The candidate advisory council shall:
8	(1)	Develop and implement a fair and independent procedure
9		for evaluating candidates to serve on the board of
10		regents;
11	(2)	Require candidates and members of their immediate
12		families to disclose any existing or anticipated
13		contracts or financial transactions with the
14		University of Hawaii and family relationships with
15		University of Hawaii employees;
16	(3)	Actively solicit and accept applications from
17		<pre>potential candidates;</pre>
18	(4)	Evaluate candidates for the board of regents on their
19		background, experience, and potential for discharging
20		the responsibilities of a member of the board of
21		regents, based upon the qualifications imposed by the
22		Hawaii state constitution; and

T	<u>(5)</u>	Present a list of at least three candidates to the
2		governor for nomination and appointment for each
3		vacant seat on the board of regents of the University
4		of Hawaii.
5	(c)	The candidate advisory council shall initiate the
6	recruitme	ent and evaluation of candidates for each vacancy on the
7	board of	regents within:
8	(1)	Thirty days of a vacancy; or
9	(2)	At least one hundred twenty days prior to the
10		expiration of a regent's term.
11	<u>(d)</u>	To provide continuity for the board of regents, the
12	governor	may recommend to the candidate advisory council the
13	reappoint	ment of a member of the board of regents, subject to
14	senate co	nfirmation.
15	<u>(e)</u>	The candidate advisory council shall consist of seven
16	members t	o be appointed without regard to section 26-34 as
17	follows:	
18	<u>(1)</u>	One member who shall be appointed by the president of
19		the senate;
20	(2)	One member who shall be appointed by the speaker of
21		the house of representatives;

1	(3) One member who shall be a representative of the
2	University of Hawaii alumni association; and
3	(4) Four members who shall be appointed by the governor;
4	provided that one member shall be a student of the university
5	who has been enrolled as a full-time student for at least three
6	consecutive semesters. A member of the association of emeritus
7	regents of the University of Hawaii shall serve as an ex-
8	officio, nonvoting member of the candidate advisory council.
9	The president of the senate, speaker of the house of
10	representatives, and governor are encouraged to appoint
11	university faculty and staff to the candidate advisory council.
12	(f) Appointees to the candidate advisory council shall
13	have a general understanding of the purposes of higher
14	education, the mission and strategic goals of the University of
15	Hawaii system, and the role and responsibilities of the board of
16	regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed
17	as having placed the broad public interest ahead of special
18	interests, are respected by the community, and are highly
19	qualified to recruit and evaluate candidates for the governor's
20	consideration.
21	(g) The candidate advisory council shall operate in a

- 1 council shall run for or hold any elected office of the State or
- 2 any of its political subdivisions. A member of the candidate
- 3 advisory council shall resign from the candidate advisory
- 4 council prior to filing nomination papers for an elected office
- 5 of the State or any of its political subdivisions.
- 6 (h) The chairperson of the candidate advisory council
- 7 shall be elected by the members of the candidate advisory
- 8 council. A majority of the members to which the candidate
- 9 advisory council is entitled shall constitute a quorum to do
- 10 business. The concurrence of a majority of all the members to
- 11 which the candidate advisory council is entitled shall be
- 12 necessary to make any action of the candidate advisory council
- 13 valid.
- 14 (i) Members of the candidate advisory council shall serve
- 15 without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
- 16 including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
- 17 their duties."
- 18 SECTION 3. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications;
- 21 meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the
- 22 general management and control of the board of regents

- 1 [consisting]. The board shall consist of fifteen members who
- 2 shall be appointed [and] by the governor from lists of qualified
- 3 candidates presented to the governor by the candidate advisory
- 4 council, pursuant to section 304A- , and shall be confirmed by
- 5 the senate; provided that if the list of qualified candidates
- 6 includes less than three candidates at any time during the
- 7 nomination and confirmation process, the governor may request
- 8 that the candidate advisory council reopen recruitment for
- 9 qualified candidates. Members may be removed by the governor
- 10 for cause. Except as otherwise provided by law, state officers
- 11 shall be eligible for appointment and membership.
- 12 The term of each member shall be five years, except as
- 13 provided for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided
- 14 that the term of the student member shall be two years. Every
- 15 member may serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term
- 16 of appointment until the member's successor has been appointed
- 17 by the governor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with
- 18 article X, section 6 of the Hawaii constitution. Members shall
- 19 serve no more than two consecutive five-year terms; provided
- 20 that the members who are initially appointed to terms of two
- 21 years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be reappointed to
- 22 two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to be appointed to

- 1 a second term of five years, the senate shall consider the
- 2 question of whether to reconfirm the member at least one hundred
- 3 twenty days prior to the conclusion of a member's first five-
- 4 year term; provided that if the senate is not in session within
- 5 one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of the member's
- 6 first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until
- 7 the senate convenes for the next regular session or the next
- 8 special session for which the senate is authorized to consider
- 9 the question of reconfirmation.
- 10 (b) In determining whether to confirm the governor's
- 11 nominee to the board of regents, the senate shall consider the
- 12 combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and
- 13 characteristics of the board of regents, as a whole, that will
- 14 best serve the diverse interests and needs of the students of
- 15 the university system and assist the university system in
- 16 achieving its strategic goals and performance indicators. The
- 17 senate shall consider whether the board reflects the diversity
- 18 of the student population, the various counties of the State,
- 19 and a broad representation of higher education-related
- 20 stakeholders.
- 21 [\(\frac{\dagger}{b}\)] (c) At [\(\frac{a meeting preceding July 1 of each year,}{\dagger}]
- 22 its first meeting after June 30, the board of regents shall



- 1 elect a chairperson and [up to two vice-chairpersons whose terms
- 2 shall be from July 1 to] vice chairperson, who shall serve until
- 3 the adjournment of the first meeting of the board of regents
- 4 after June 30 of the next year, or thereafter until their
- 5 successors are elected; provided that the chairperson and vice
- 6 chairperson shall not be elected prior to the appointment of
- 7 regents whose terms shall begin on July 1. The board shall
- 8 appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of the board.
- 9 The president of the university shall act as executive officer
- 10 of the board. A majority of the board of regents shall
- 11 constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the concurrence of
- 12 a majority of all the members to which the board of regents is
- 13 entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the board of
- 14 regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten times annually
- 15 and, from time to time, may meet in each of the counties of
- 16 Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.
- 17 [(c)] (d) The governor shall notify the [regents]
- 18 candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the
- 19 University of Hawaii in writing within ten days of receiving
- 20 notification that a member of the board of regents is resigning,
- 21 has died, or is being removed by the governor.

13	(1)	For two seats from the same county or two at large
14		seats, no fewer than four and no more than six
15		candidates;
16	(2)	For three seats from the same county, no fewer than
17		five and no more than eight candidates; and
18	(3)	For more than three seats, the regents candidate
19		advisory council shall determine appropriate minimum
20		numbers of candidates, which shall provide for at
21		least three candidates for the final seat, and maximum
22		numbers of candidates.

1	(d)	In making its presentations, the regents candidate
2	advisory	council shall:
3	(1)	Develop a statement that includes the selection
4		criteria to be applied and a description of the
5		responsibilities and duties of a member of the board
6		of regents and distribute this statement to potential
7		candidates;
8	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
9		board of regents based on their background,
10		experience; and potential for discharging the
11		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;
12	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
13		solicit and accept applications from potential
14		candidates;
15	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
16		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
17		serve on the board of regents;
18	(5)	Ensure student involvement by establishing a student
19		advisory group composed of:
20		(A) The senior student affairs officer of the
21		University of Hawaii system:

1		(B)	No fewer than three student representatives from
2			the University of Hawaii student caucus who shall
3			represent, to the maximum extent possible, the
4			interests of the various University of Hawaii
5			campuses on each island; and
6		(C)	No fewer than three student life advisors who
7			shall represent, to the maximum extent possible,
8			the interests of the various University of Hawaii
9			campuses on each island,
10		who-	shall work with and assist the regents candidate
11		advi	sory council to recruit and evaluate candidates
12		for	the student member of the board of regents and
13		make	recommendations to the regents candidate advisory
14		coun	cil based on the qualifications of the candidates

16	(6)	Requ	ire each candidate to disclose any existing or
17		anti	cipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or
18		any	existing or anticipated financial transactions

21	regents c	andid	ate advisory council shall make available the

1	names of	candidates to the public through the University of

3	(e) -	For each-board seat to be filled, the governor shall
4	select on	e nominee from among the candidates submitted by the
5	regents c	andidate advisory council.
6	(£)	The regents candidate advisory council shall consist
7	of seven	members to be appointed without regard to section 26 34
8	as follow	s :
9	(1)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
10		senate;
11	(2)	One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the

13	(3)	One member shall be appointed by the governor;

8		Caucus;
9	(6)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
10		the Association of Emeritus Regents; and
11	(7)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
12		University of Hawaii Alumni Association;
13	provided	that members appointed under paragraphs (4) to (7)
14	shall be	selected from the general public and may include
15	members o	f the constituencies represented; provided further that

Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed 2 as having placed the broad public interest ahead of special 3 interests, having achieved a high level of prominence in their 4 respective professions, and being respected members of the 5 community. 6 (g) Members of the regents candidate advisory council 7 shall serve four year terms. 8 (h) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in 9 the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the 10 person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy 11 shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's 12 predecessor. 13 (i) The regents candidate advisory council shall operate 14 in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member 15 of the regents candidate advisory council, shall run for or hold 16 any elected office under the United States or the State or any 17 of its political subdivisions. 18 (j) The members of the regents candidate advisory council 19 shall choose a chairperson from among themselves. A majority of 20 all the members to which the regents candidate advisory council 21 is entitled shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. The 22 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the

1 checks; credit reports; surveys and reports prepared for or on 2 the regents candidate advisory council's behalf; the results of 3 any evaluations or assessments conducted by the regents 4 candidate advisory council; the substance and details of any 5 discussions with regents candidate advisory council members; and 6 the substance and details of discussions and deliberations of 7 the regents candidate advisory council and any of its committees 8 during-meetings."] 9 SECTION 5. The members of the regents candidate advisory 10 council who are serving on the effective date of this Act shall 11 serve until the council is reconstituted by the appointment of 12 the seven members to the council pursuant to this Act, at which 13 time the members of the regents candidate advisory council who 14 are serving on the effective date of this Act shall be 15 discharged from office and the members appointed by the 16 president of the senate, speaker of the house of **17** representatives, and governor pursuant to this Act shall begin 18 their service. The president of the senate, speaker of the 19 house of representatives, and governor shall appoint the 20 requisite number of members to the council no later than 21 days after the effective date of this Act.

- 1 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
