## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has a
shortage of physicians compared to similar populations
throughout the United States. Studies of the physician
workforce in Hawaii demonstrate extreme shortages of primary
care specialties, most notably in rural areas. Rising demand or
the health care system in Hawaii because of population growth,
aging, and the prevalence of chronic disease calls for an
increase in the existing physician base. Access to a personal
physician has been shown to decrease morbidity and mortality
while controlling health care costs through early detection and
careful management of chronic disease and deferral of
unnecessary hospital admission and emergency room visits.
Despite this shortage, many medical students graduating
with considerable debt feel compelled to choose a non-primary-
care specialty with higher compensation in order to repay
student loans. In addition, the current stock of physicians is
rapidly approaching retirement age, suggesting a contraction in
the existing physician workforce. As the United States develops SB665 HD1 HMS 2013-2870

- 1 the accountable care organization model for use across the
- 2 country, the competition to recruit new primary care providers
- 3 will increase.
- 4 Furthermore, physicians tend to remain and practice where
- 5 they train. If capable medical students leave Hawaii to train
- 6 elsewhere, they are less likely to return and practice in
- 7 Hawaii. Compelling research suggests that if both medical
- 8 school and residency are completed in Hawaii, eighty-five per
- 9 cent of physicians will remain and practice in Hawaii.
- 10 The legislature further finds that a comprehensive approach
- 11 that addresses the primary care workforce shortage in Hawaii
- 12 requires incentivizing primary care by:
- 13 (1) Reducing medical school debt via a loan repayment
- 14 program for medical students and other health
- 15 professionals who serve in shortage specialties and
- underserved areas of Hawaii;
- 17 (2) Ensuring a culturally competent workforce for the
- 18 unique and diverse peoples of Hawaii with support for
- 19 programs and initiatives such as the Imi Hoola
- 20 program, which brings disadvantaged young people into
- 21 medical careers, and the native Hawaiian student

1		pathway to medicine program, which supports workforce	
2		diversity; and	
3	(3)	Expanding available graduate medical education or	
4		residency training positions in primary care for	
5		students, such as doubling the faculty and	
6		infrastructure of the existing family medicine	
7		residency program at the John A. Burns school of	
8		medicine and developing new accredited family health	
9		centers in association with teaching hospitals.	
10	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to address the		
11	shortage of primary care physicians in the State by making an		
12	appropriation for the Hawaii health corps and diversity program		
13	and primary care workforce expansion at the John A. Burns schoo		
14	of medicine.		
15	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
16	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$300,000 or so much	
17	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the	
18	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year		
19	2014-2015 for deposit into the Hawaii health corps revolving		
20	fund.	,	
21	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii health	
22	corps rev	olving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as

- 1 may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the same sum or
- 2 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015
- 3 for the purposes of the Hawaii health corps program, pursuant to
- 4 chapter 309H, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 6 of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine and the University of
- 7 Hawaii at Manoa school of nursing and dental hygiene for the
- 8 purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$560,000 or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
- 12 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 13 2014-2015 to support programs of the John A. Burns school of
- 14 medicine's native Hawaiian center of excellence such as the Imi
- 15 Hoola program and the native Hawaiian student pathway to
- 16 medicine program.
- 17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 18 of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine for the purposes of
- 19 this Act.
- 20 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the

- 1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2 2014-2015 for increases in the faculty and infrastructure of the
- 3 existing family medicine residency program and development of
- 4 new accredited family health centers in association with
- 5 teaching hospitals.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the John A.
- 7 Burns school of medicine for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
