A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELAND SECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is an ever 2 increasing possibility of terrorist or other man-made threats to: infrastructure critical to national security; local, state 3 4 and federal governmental entities; and the stability and 5 security of the citizens of Hawaii. The increasing sophistication of terrorist groups, transnational criminal 6 7 organizations, and others who would threaten the peace and security of Hawaii greatly complicates the State's ability to 8 9 protect its citizens and prevent attacks. 10

The legislature also finds that state departments and agencies are performing many missions and tasks to combat terrorism and support homeland security requirements without underlying statutory authority or enabling legislation.

The purpose of this Act is to establish a homeland security
office to provide a comprehensive program to protect our
citizens, infrastructure, and government from terrorism and

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threat of attack.

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1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HOMELAND SECURITY
6	§ -1 Policy and purpose. The legislature finds that
7	because of the existing and increasing possibility of the
8	occurrence of terrorist attacks of unprecedented size and
9	destructiveness, in order to ensure that preparations of this
10	State will be adequate to deal with such attacks, preserve the
11	lives and property of the people of the State, and protect the
12	public peace, health, and safety, it is necessary to:
13	(1) Provide for homeland security by the State and to
14	authorize the creation of organizations for homeland
15	security in the counties of the State; and
16	(2) Provide programs, in coordination with county
17	agencies, other state and federal agencies, and the
18	private sector, to educate and train publicly and
19	privately employed workers and the general public to
20	be prepared for attacks.

- 1 The purpose of this chapter is to enact a homeland security
- 2 law to provide for all homeland security functions of this State
- 3 and its counties.
- 4 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
- 5 "Attack" means any attack or series of attacks by anyone
- 6 causing, or which may cause, damage or injury to persons or
- 7 property in the United States in any manner by the use of
- 8 chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, explosives,
- 9 firearms, cyber, or other weapons or processes; and any form of
- 10 hostile action.
- "County" means any of the political subdivisions including
- 12 the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai and the city and county
- 13 of Honolulu, but does not include the county of Kalawao.
- "Director of homeland security" or "director" means the
- 15 adjutant general.
- 16 "Facilities", except as otherwise provided in this chapter,
- 17 includes buildings and other structures, shelters, land, and
- 18 appurtenant materials.
- "Homeland security" means a concerted effort to:
- 20 (1) Prevent terrorist attacks within the United States;
- 21 (2) Reduce the State's vulnerability to terrorism and
- 22 attacks; and

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- (3) Minimize the damage and recover from attacks that
 occur.
- 3 "Necessary" means any methods, measures, or other actions
- 4 or determinations as are necessary in the opinion of the
- 5 governor or the governor's authorized representative or a mayor
- 6 or mayor's authorized representative.
- 7 "States" includes the several states of the United States,
- 8 the District of Columbia, and the possessions and territories of
- 9 the United States.
- 10 § -3 State homeland security office. (a) There shall
- 11 be established within the department of defense a homeland
- 12 security office. The director of homeland security shall employ
- 13 appropriate personnel and make expenditures as may be necessary
- 14 to carry out this chapter. The director shall appoint an
- 15 administrator of homeland security who shall be exempt from
- 16 chapter 76, subject to removal by the director, and receive
- 17 compensation as the director may determine.
- 18 (b) The director shall be responsible for formulating and
- 19 carrying out programs for homeland security. The director shall
- 20 ensure coordination and cooperation among all organizations for
- 21 homeland security; public agencies, including county, state, and
- 22 federal agencies; and private organizations and shall cooperate

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with state, county, and federal homeland security and law 1 2 enforcement agencies. 3 -4 Homeland security responsibilities. The director 4 may: 5 (1)Prepare comprehensive plans and programs for homeland 6 security and homeland defense; provided that these 7 plans and programs shall be integrated and coordinated 8 with the plans of the counties and the federal 9 government to the fullest possible extent; **10** (2) Make studies and surveys of the vulnerabilities of 11 critical infrastructure and key resources in this 12 State as may be necessary, and participate in planning 13 for their protection; 14 (3) Develop and maintain a critical infrastructure list, 15 coordinating the list with the counties of the State, 16 other state agencies, federal agencies (including 17 defense and homeland security), the private sector, 18 and other agencies and organizations as necessary; 19 (4)Develop and maintain a capability to process security 20 clearance applications for civilian workers of the

state and county governments;

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1	(5)	Foster coordination on security matters with all
2		nations of the Pacific region to the extent permitted
3		under federal law, including but not limited to
4		coordinating planning efforts, as appropriate,
5		sponsoring discussions and seminars, and hosting
6		periodic international conferences; and
7	(6)	Solicit and manage funding, including but not limited
8		to grants from the federal government, funds from
9		other divisions in the department of defense and other
10		state agencies, and funds to provide personnel support
11		to the homeland security office.
12	\$	-5 County organizations for homeland security.
13	Counties	are authorized, but not required, to establish
14	organizat	ions for homeland security. If a county does not
15	establish	a separate organization for homeland security, the
16	functions listed in section -4 shall be incorporated into the	
17	responsibilities of the county civil defense agency."	
18	SECT	ION 3. Section 26-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
20	"(a)	The department of defense shall be headed by a single
21	executive	to be known as the adjutant general. The adjutant

- 1 general shall also be the director of civil defense [-] and the
- 2 director of homeland security.
- 3 There shall be a full-time vice director of civil defense
- 4 who shall be appointed and may be removed by the director.
- 5 The department shall be responsible for the defense of the
- 6 State and its people from mass violence, originating from either
- 7 human or natural causes.
- 8 The devolution of command of the military forces in the
- 9 absence of the adjutant general shall be within the military
- 10 establishment. The devolution of command of the civil defense
- 11 agency in the absence of the director of civil defense shall be
- 12 within the civil defense agency."
- SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
