A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SEWER SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that sewer fees in the
2 city and county of Honolulu have been drastically increased to
3 finance the maintenance of the aging sewer system. The purpose
4 of this Act is to ensure that sewer fees collected from
5 ratepayers are used to improve, repair, upgrade, and retrofit
6 the existing sewer system, and to prevent the expenditure of
7 increased sewer fees to finance new projects outside of the
8 urban core.

9 SECTION 2. No county with a population greater than five
10 hundred thousand shall undertake any sewer system project unless
11 the existing sewer system in the census-designated place that
12 has that county's largest population density has been upgraded
13 and retrofitted to serve current and future capacity.

14 For the purposes of this Act:

15 "Census-designated place" means a concentration of
16 population identified by the United States Census Bureau for
17 statistical purposes.




1 "Sewer system" means a system of piping, with
2 appurtenances, for collecting and conveying sewage from source
3 to discharge.

4 "Sewer system project" means any project to construct a new
5 sewer system, and does not include any improvement or
6 construction project undertaken to satisfy the requirements of
7 this Act.

8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
9 and shall be repealed on the date the governor issues a
10 proclamation that a county with a population greater than five
11 hundred thousand meets the requirements of section 2 of this
12 Act.
