
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII LABOR RELATIONS BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 89-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:

3 "(e) Any action taken by the board shall be by a simple
4 majority of the members of the board. All decisions of the
5 board shall be reduced to writing and shall state separately its
6 finding of fact and conclusions. Any vacancy in the board shall
7 not impair the authority of the remaining members to exercise
8 all the powers of the board. The [~~governor~~] chief justice may
9 appoint an acting member of the board during the temporary
10 absence from the State [~~or the~~], temporary inability to act due
11 to recusal, or illness of any regular member. An acting member,
12 during the acting member's term of service, shall have the same
13 powers and duties as the regular member[-]; provided that:

14 (1) Subsection (d) shall not apply to an acting member;

15 and

16 (2) An acting member appointed due to a regular member's
17 recusal shall be appointed for the case in which the
18 recusal occurred, and the acting member's appointment



1 shall terminate when the final decision is filed or
2 the case is withdrawn."

3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2113.

Hawaii Labor Relations Board; Temporary Member

Description:

Authorizes the Chief Justice to appoint an acting member of the Hawaii Labor Relations Board if a regular member is temporarily unable to act due to absence from the state, recusal, or illness. Clarifies that an acting member shall be appointed for the case in which the recusal occurred, and that the acting member's appointment shall terminate when the final decision is filed or the case is withdrawn. Effective July 1, 2113. (SB890 HD1)
