## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC ARCHIVES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 94, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding three new sections to be appropriately designated and
3	to read as follows:
4	"§94- Definitions. For the purposes of this chapter,
5	unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
6	"Disposition" means actions resulting in the transfer to
7	the state archives or destruction of records as documented in
8	the records retention and disposition schedule or other
9	authority.
10	"Enduring value" means the continued significance of
11	records determined by their legal, fiscal, administrative, or
12	historical value that warrants their preservation by the state
13	archives.
14	"Preservation" means a series of managed activities
15	necessary to protect machine readable records from loss,
16	alteration, deterioration, and technological obsolescence to
17	ensure an accurate rendering of those records in perpetuity in

an environment independent from that which produced them.

1	"Rec	ords" means information with fixed form and content,
2	regardles	s of physical form or characteristics, created or
3	received	in the course of government activity and set aside as
4	evidence	of that activity. In databases, "records" mean a
5	collectio	n of related data fields.
6	"Rec	ords retention and disposition schedule" means a
7	records d	isposition authorization (form SA-1) or general records
8	schedule	issued by the state comptroller, pursuant to section
9	94-3.	
10	<u>§94-</u>	The state archivist. The department of accounting
11	and gener	al services shall fulfill its responsibilities for the
12	public ar	chives through the state archivist. The state
13	archivist	shall:
14	(1)	Administer the state archives, records management, and
15		digital archives programs and facilities;
16	(2)	Advise and assist state agencies in the preparation of
17		retention and disposition schedules for government
18		records; and provide records management training and
19		technical assistance services to agencies;
20	(3)	Issue guidelines and standards, including those
21		applicable to computer hardware and software, for the
22		preservation of government records maintained by state

1		record keeping systems, including but not limited to
2		digital imaging processes for scanning of records and
3		technology for creating and storing electronic
4		records;
5	(4)	Adopt rules as may be necessary for the acquisition,
6		maintenance, access, and preservation of government
7		records, as well as the use of records or other
8		materials, in the custody of the state archives; and
9	(5)	Request and obtain an electronic copy of any
10		government record of enduring value currently in
11		digital format into the digital archives to ensure the
12		long-term preservation of the record.

14	special f	und; state archives preservation fee. (a) There shall
15	be establ	ished in the state treasury the state archives
16	preservat	ion and long-term access special fund for the
17	preservat	ion and long-term access to government records.
18	(b)	All revenues collected from fees for services provided
19	by the sta	ate archives shall be deposited in the state archives
20	preservat	ion and long-term access special fund and be expended
21	by the co	mptroller to carry out the purposes of this section,

- 1 operational costs of the program. All interest earned or
- 2 accrued on moneys deposited in the fund shall become part of the
- 3 fund.
- 4 (c) In addition to any other fee authorized by law, a
- 5 state archives preservation fee of \$1 shall be assessed for each
- 6 document that is filed or registered by members of the public
- 7 with a governmental entity and listed on an authorized records
- 8 retention and disposition schedule as permanent. The
- 9 preservation fee shall be collected and deposited in the state
- 10 archives preservation and long-term access special fund and used
- 11 to preserve and keep accessible electronic records of such
- 12 documents in a useable state for the good of the public."
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 94-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 "\$94-1 Duties of department. The department of accounting
- 16 and general services shall collect all public archives;
- 17 preserve, arrange, [classify,] describe, and inventory the same;
- 18 provide for their safekeeping; and compile and furnish
- 19 information concerning them. The department may adopt and use a
- 20 seal and may adopt, amend, or revise from time to time such
- 21 rules and regulations as it may consider expedient for the
- 22 conduct of its business."

  SECTION 4. Section 94-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:
- "\$94-4 Certificate to same. The comptroller of the State
  and the state archivist or other officer performing the duties
  of state archivist or custodian of the [public] state archives
  are severally authorized and empowered to certify, as true and
  correct, copies or reproductions of any of the [books,]
  documents, papers, writings, or other government records, or
- excerpts therefrom in their custody. Fees for copying,

  certification, and other services shall be prescribed by the

  comptroller in direct relation to the cost of the services.
- The above fees shall not be charged where the work involved is required by any department or branch of the federal, state, or county governments."
- 17 SECTION 5. Section 94-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 repealed.
