
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF
HONOLULU TO HONOR "GENERAL" JOHN H. ROGERS, JR., FOR
DEDICATED SERVICE TO OUR COUNTRY.

1 WHEREAS, "General" John H. Rogers' dedication to his
2 country, the active duty and retired military community, and
3 others has inspired others to live up to standards and
4 traditions for which Americans are known and respected around
5 the world; and
6

7 WHEREAS, "General" Rogers has worked tirelessly to ease the
8 suffering of those unfortunate children who were directly
9 affected during and after the conflict in Vietnam, where he
10 served in the United States Army from 1967 to 1972; and
11

12 WHEREAS, when Saigon fell in 1975, "General" Rogers, whose
13 wife and daughter are Vietnamese, was in the United States and
14 lost track of his daughter; and
15

16 WHEREAS, "General" Rogers was reunited with his daughter,
17 Gloria Jean Rogers, in a subsequent trip to Vietnam in search of
18 her, and now lives in Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and
19

20 WHEREAS, on his 1988 trip to Vietnam to find Gloria, he
21 discovered the plight of American-Asian children that were
22 fathered by American servicemen and orphaned by the war; and
23

24 WHEREAS, in compassion for these children, "General" Rogers
25 founded the Foundation for Amerasian Children Emergency Support
26 (FACES-USA) and established orphanages and safe houses for
27 American-Asian children who had been living as beggars on the
28 streets of Saigon and other large cities; and
29

30 WHEREAS, after opening the first halfway house for
31 American-Asian children in Ho Chi Minh City on May 2, 1989,
32 "General" Rogers became known as the "Pied Piper of Vietnam" and



1 was applauded by President George H.W. Bush and the United
2 States Department of State for his efforts to improve the
3 welfare of American-Asians in Vietnam; and
4

5 WHEREAS, since the end of the war in 1975, "General" Rogers
6 appeared on numerous national television broadcasts for his
7 humanitarian work for Vietnamese-Americans, veterans, and
8 homeless persons, including NBC's "Today Show" FOX's "Inside
9 Edition", and many local affiliates of ABC, CBS, NBC, and FOX,
10 as well as television programs in Australia, France, Germany,
11 Thailand, Vietnam, the Philippines, and Spain, and was the
12 subject of newspaper reports on his efforts; and
13

14 WHEREAS, inspired by the 1932 World War I Veterans Bonus
15 March and the 1995 Million Man March, "General" Rogers brought
16 together private corporations, concerned individuals, and
17 national and grassroots veterans organizations nationwide for
18 the inaugural National Veterans Rights March/Rally in 1996,
19 which saw the participation of hundreds of thousands of
20 veterans; and
21

22 WHEREAS, "General" Rogers founded BRAVO HAWAII, the Hawaii
23 chapter of the Brotherhood Rally of All Veterans Organizations,
24 and collaborated with agencies and other groups in organizing
25 humanitarian activities and programs to support veterans, such
26 as "Picnic in the Park", "Stand Downs", and weekly meals for
27 homeless veterans and the homeless at Fort DeRussy Beach; and
28

29 WHEREAS, on April 26, 1997, "General" Rogers opened
30 Hawaii's first ever "Homeless Veterans Transitional Center" in
31 Wahiawa for homeless veterans, their spouses, and children who
32 have fallen on hard times to give them a hand up, not a hand
33 out, and preserve their sense of their own human dignity; and

35 WHEREAS, past governors of Hawaii and mayors of the City
36 and County of Honolulu have honored "General" Rogers for his
37 humanitarian work; and

39 WHEREAS, "General" Rogers produced and hosted a monthly
40 community television program called "BRAVO HAWAII Veterans Talk,
41 Bringing Veterans Together" to discuss veterans and military
42 related issues, activities, and programs; and

1 WHEREAS, the third of eleven children and a native of
2 Oxford, Mississippi, "General" Rogers served in the Army for
3 twenty-two years, retired on June 1, 1988, as a Master Sergeant,
4 and earned several awards and decorations, including the Bronze
5 Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal,
6 and Vietnam Service Medal with six campaign stars; and
7

8 WHEREAS, on January 10, 1994, "General" Rogers was invited
9 by Congressman Lucien E. Blackwell of Pennsylvania to join him
10 and members of Congress on a fact finding mission to the
11 Philippines pursuant to H.R. 2013 (103rd), "Commission on
12 Filipino Veterans Entitlement Act" and H.R. 2429, "The
13 Philippines Amerasians Act of 1993"; and
14

15 WHEREAS, "General" Rogers has received several
16 proclamations from the Governor of Hawaii and the Mayor of
17 Honolulu, and governors of twelve states, for "Amerasians
18 Awareness Day" in their states; now, therefore,
19

20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-Seventh
21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, the
22 House of Representatives concurring, that the Mayor and Council
23 of the City and County of Honolulu are requested to recognize
24 and honor "General" John H. Rogers, Jr. for his tireless
25 dedication and efforts to humanitarian causes by placing a
26 plaque on the corner of Kalakaua Avenue and Kapiolani Boulevard,
27 where he waved his flag to remind others of the ideals and
28 compassionate acts for which America stands; and

30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
31 Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor and Council of the City
32 and County of Honolulu.
