
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING MARCH AS BRAIN INJURY AWARENESS MONTH.

1 WHEREAS, brain injury is a serious, national public health
2 epidemic affecting 5.3 million Americans, with a person
3 sustaining a brain injury every twenty-one seconds; and
4

5 WHEREAS, each year, at least fifty thousand Americans die
6 and eighty thousand Americans experience the onset of life-long
7 disabilities as a result of sustaining a brain injury; and
8

9 WHEREAS, brain injury can affect every aspect of an
10 individual's life, including physical, cognitive, emotional,
11 social, and behavioral aspects; and

13 WHEREAS, the majority of people who suffer from mild or
14 moderate brain injuries recover fully, but the effects, while
15 they last, can be confusing, frightening, and disruptive; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the Brain Injury Association of Hawaii is
18 dedicated to improving the quality of life of persons with brain
19 injury; increasing public awareness by providing educational
20 information, resources, and support for individuals who have
21 sustained a brain injury; and promoting prevention of brain
22 injuries in our community; now, therefore,

24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-seventh
25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2013, the
26 House of Representatives concurring, that March be designated as
27 Brain Injury Awareness Month to increase public awareness and
28 education regarding the seriousness of brain injuries, support
29 for individuals who have sustained brain injuries, and ways to
30 prevent brain injury; and

33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director
34 of Health, and the Brain Injury Association of Hawaii.
