<u>HB 566</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DIGITAL MEDIA INFRASTRUCTURE. Establishes an income tax credit for qualified media infrastructure projects.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 698</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Amends the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit by (1) adding additional work and infrastructure incentive credits; (2) establishing a qualified persons crew training and advancement program rebate; (3) requiring the payment of a fee to apply for the tax credit; (4) increasing the cap amount of the tax credit; and (5) requiring that a waiver be granted to include the wages of nonresident crew in qualified production costs. Sunset 01/01/2018.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 726</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FILM AND DIGITAL MEDIA INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT. Extends the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit from 01/01/2016 to 01/01/2023. Repeals the credit ceiling per qualified production. Increases in the credit amount from 15% to 20% in a county with a population over 700,000, and from 20% to 25% in a county with a population of 700,000 or less.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 1463</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY. Invests in technology development by facilitating a connection between the high technology industry and visitors to the State. Appropriates funds to high technology development corporation to develop program to attract out-of-state software programmers and other high-technology workers to work in Hawaii.	EDB, FIN



HB 166, HD1
(HSCR70)
Status

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.
Requires that at least three per cent of the twenty per cent set-aside for small businesses shall be awarded to veteran-owned and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses. Stipulates that this preference is in addition to any other preferences provided under the procurement code. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB166 HD1)

HB 1128, HD1
(HSCR211)
Status

RELATING TO INTRA-STATE AVIATION.
Exempts the general excise and use taxes on fuel sold from a foreign-trade zone to common carriers for use in interisland air transportation. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB1128 HD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

PAPER: 1 copies (including an original) to Room 318 in the State Capitol;


