<u>SB 1135, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR658)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RECYCLING. Amends and expands the Electronic Waste and Television Recycling program. Effective date is 7/1/50. (SD2)	EEP/HLT, JUD, FIN
<u>SB 1143, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR612)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONTROL. Establishes filing fees to help fund operations of the Office of Environmental Quality Control; creates a special fund and authorizes expenditures out of the special fund; and provides for a lag time for collection of fees. Effective 7/1/50. (SD2)	EEP/HLT, FIN
<u>SB 454, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR153)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WATER CONSERVATION. Encourages the department of health and the counties to promote widespread use of gray water in the interests of water conservation. Requires use of gray water to conform to the latest edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code. Defines gray water. (SD1)	EEP, WAL
<u>SB 1133, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR683)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE DEPOSIT BEVERAGE CONTAINER PROGRAM. Removes the exemption for dietary supplements in amounts greater than one ounce from the deposit beverage container program. Effective 7/1/50. (SD2)	EEP, CPC, FIN



<u>SB 1132, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR679)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SOLID WASTE. Increases the solid waste management surcharge to \$1.25 per ton of solid waste disposed of in landfills or shipped out-of-state; increases the solid waste management surcharge to 60 cents per ton of solid waste disposed of at waste-to-energy facilities that accept 150,000 tons or more of solid waste annually; provides for no surcharges to waste-to-energy facilities that accept less than 150,000 tons of solid waste annually and for ash disposed of in landfills that originates from a waste-to-energy facility; and defines "waste-to-energy facility". Effective 7/1/50. (SD1)	EEP, FIN
<u>SB 1131, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR589)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RECYCLING. Establishes a tiered glass advance disposal fee based on the capacity of the glass container. Effective 7/1/50. (SD2)	EEP, FIN
<u>SB 497, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR572)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BEACH NOURISHMENT. Appropriates funds for the environmental impact statement associated with the planned beach nourishment project at Kaanapali beach on the island of Maui; provided that no funds shall be expended unless matched dollar-for-dollar with private funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EEP, FIN
<u>SB 623, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR762)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY. Replaces the current renewable energy technology systems tax credit with tax credits for solar energy property and wind energy property. Requires DOTAX and DBEDT to report tax credits claimed under section 235-12.5, HRS. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)	EEP, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 1087, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR816)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE. Establishes a regulatory financing structure that authorizes the PUC and DBEDT to provide low-cost loans for green infrastructure equipment to achieve measurable cost savings and Hawaii's clean energy goals. Requires a report to the legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)	EEP, CPC, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
