<u>HB 527. HD1</u> <u>(HSCR67)</u> Status	RELATING TO UNIFORM MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE. Repeals the uniform maintenance allowance for enlisted personnel of the Hawaii National Guard. Effective July 1, 2013.	VMI, FIN
<u>HB 158. HD2</u> <u>(HSCR293)</u> Status	RELATING TO TUITION ASSISTANCE. Broadens the scope of tuition assistance to Hawaii National Guard members working toward a degree on any campus of the University of Hawaii system with priority given under specified conditions.	VMI, HED, FIN
<u>HB 166. HD2</u> <u>(HSCR454)</u> Status	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires that a percentage of the annual purchasing expenditure of the State set-aside for small businesses be awarded to veteran-owned and service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses, in addition to any other preferences provided under the Procurement Code for such businesses. Effective July 1, 2050.	VMI, EDB, FIN
<u>HB 196</u> <u>(HSCR291)</u> Status	RELATING TO VETERANS TREATMENT COURT. Appropriates funds for positions to support a veterans treatment court in the first circuit.	VMI, JUD, FIN



<u>HB 1396, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR457)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE JAPANESE AMERICAN EXPERIENCE IN HAWAII. Appropriates funds for the planning, design, and construction of the Nisei Veterans Legacy Center and a Honouliuli Internment Camp Education Center. Release of appropriation is subject to matching funds. Allows the value of in-kind donations to be calculated in the matching amount, subject to verification by the director of finance. Effective July 1, 2050.	VMI, HED, FIN
<u>HB 1392, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR458)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PRESERVATION OF HAWAII'S MOVING IMAGES. Appropriates funds for the 'Ulu'ulu: The Henry Ku'ualoha Giugni Moving Image Archive of Hawai'i to support the activities of the moving image archive. Effective July 1, 2050.	VMI, HED, FIN
<u>HB 494, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR259)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO URBAN ART. Establishes a pilot program for the creation of urban art under the direction of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts, to be repealed on June 30, 2016. Effective July 1, 2050.	VMI, FIN
<u>HB 799, HD2</u> <u>(HSCR396)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CREATIVE MEDIA DEVELOPMENT. Amends motion picture, digital media, and film production tax credits. Deletes Internet-only distribution exclusion for advertising; clarifies definitions of qualified production costs; and extends the sunset date to January 1, 2025.	VMI, EDB, FIN
<u>HB 70, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR274)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. Deletes the repeal of the High Technology Innovation Corporation and the Corporation's exemption from the Procurement Code. Effective June 29, 2013.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 471</u> <u>(HSCR280)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO STARLIGHT RESERVE. Extends termination date of temporary advisory committee relating to the statewide starlight reserve strategy from June 30, 2013, to June 30, 2015. Effective June 29, 2013.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 473</u> <u>(HSCR275)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY. Authorizes businesses operating within a research and technology park, in an existing enterprise zone, to receive same benefits available to other businesses in the same enterprise zone. Authorizes the projects of the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii Authority, conducted within state enterprise zones, to receive the same benefits available to other businesses in the same enterprise zone.	EDB, FIN
<u>HB 726, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR455)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FILM AND DIGITAL MEDIA INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT. Extends the motion picture, digital media, and film production income tax credit until 2023. Increases the credit ceiling to an unspecified amount. Increases, by an unspecified amount, the credit per cent both in counties with a population above or below 700,000.	EDB, FIN



<u>HB 276, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR13)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE SENIOR RESIDENCE AT PIIKOI, OAHU. Authorizes the director of finance to issue general obligation bonds for the construction of the Senior Residence at Piikoi, an affordable senior rental housing project on Oahu. Effective July 1, 2013.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 427, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR392)</u> <u>Status</u>	PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 15, OF THE HAWAII STATE CONSTITUTION TO ALLOW ELECTRONIC COPIES, AS AN ALTERNATIVE TO PRINTED COPIES, OF A BILL TO BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR MEMBERS OF A HOUSE IN WHICH THE BILL IS BEING VOTED UPON FOR THIRD OR FINAL READING IN FULFILLMENT OF THE FORTY-EIGHT HOUR AVAILABILITY REQUIREMENT. Allows electronic copies, as an alternative to printed copies, of a bill to be made available for members of a house in which the bill is being voted upon for third or final reading, in fulfillment of the 48-hour availability requirement. <u>HB 410, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR414)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO JURY DUTY. Exempts breastfeeding mothers from jury duty.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1481, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR577)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING. Creates public funding program of candidates for the offices of state senator and state representative. Exempts the offices of governor, lieutenant governor, state senator, and state representative from the scope of the partial public financing law. Appropriates funds to the campaign spending commission to prepare for the public financing of elections in 2014. Effective January 1, 2015.	JUD, FIN

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through the website); or


WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.
