Establishes the Return-to-Home program and special fund. Establishes nighttime parking lots for homeless persons. Establishes camping locations for homeless persons. SB 1235, SD2 (HSCR941) Status	<p>RELATING TO CABLE TELEVISION. Appropriates funds to ‘Oiwi TV for the production and distribution of Hawaiian language content on cable television. Effective 7/1/2050.</p>	OMH, FIN

Appropriates funds to support the investigative stage of the Pacific international space center for exploration systems sustainable concrete initiative, contingent upon a dollar-for-dollar match from other sources. SB 1068, SD2, HD1 (HSCR1209) Status	<p>RELATING TO MONEY TRANSMITTERS. Authorizes the Commissioner of Financial Institutions to require money transmitters to register with NMLS. Establishes procedures for a licensed money transmitter to surrender its license. Amends the bond requirement, the fee structure for services provided by the Division of Financial Institutions of the DCCA for the regulation of money transmitters, and the fine for violations of money transmitter regulations.
