<u>HB 1440, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR465)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DRIVER EDUCATION. Requires driver education programs to include the distribution of information on organ and tissue donation. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB1440 HD1)	TRN, HLT
<u>HB 1131, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR379)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SCHOOL ENTRANCE. Requires, with specified exceptions, that a student have a dental examination and provide proof of such prior to initial entrance in any school in the State. (HB1131 HD1)	EDN, HLT
<u>HB 373</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MAMMOGRAPHY REPORTING. Beginning January 1, 2014, requires health care facilities performing mammography exams to provide to patients with dense breast tissue, a mammography report and notification about associated cancer risks and supplemental screening benefits.	HLT
<u>HB 903, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR573)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WATER POLLUTION. Establishes a separate Water Pollution Control account and authorizes the Director of Health to prescribe fees to help fund operations of the Department of Health in managing pollution from nonpoint sources and individual wastewater systems. Effective July 1, 2013. (HB903 HD1)	EEP, HLT

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.



While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 2 copies (including an original) to Room 310 in the State Capitol;

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 808-586-6281 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through the website); or

WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
