The following measure(s) were previously heard on **February 19, 2013**.

<u>HB 849, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR247)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT. Recodifies Hawaii's emergency management statutes by updating the statutes, clarifying the relationship between the state and county emergency management agencies, and delineating the emergency management functions and powers of the Governor and mayors. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB849 HD1)	PBS/VMI, JUD
<u>HB 1041</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LEAF BLOWERS. Restricts the use of leaf blowers to two hours between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any day. Makes it illegal to operate a gasoline-powered leaf blower within a residential zone unless the operator is personnel of a licensed business.	JUD

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **February 21, 2013**.



HB 1066
Status RELATING TO PROSTITUTION. JUD
Makes solicitation of a minor for prostitution a crime. Increases the statute of limitations to bring a cause of action for coercion into prostitution from two to six years. Clarifies the minimum and maximum fine for a person convicted of committing the offense of prostitution. Adds the offenses of solicitation of a minor for prostitution, habitual solicitation of prostitution, and solicitation of prostitution near schools and public parks under the State's forfeiture laws. Amends the definition of "sexual offense" under the sexual offender registry laws to include acts that consist of the solicitation of a minor who is less than eighteen years of age for prostitution.

HB 321
Status RELATING TO ELECTIONS. JUD
Provides a process for voter registration on election day at polling places.

HB 785
Status RELATING TO PRODUCTION OF RECORDS. JUD
Amends provisions of Act 325, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, which allow for the service of process issued by another state upon a Hawaii recipient and clarifies the following: (1) that the service of process may be upon a person or business, but not a government agency; (2) that the process is for the production of records; (3) that the process must be based upon a pending criminal investigation or prosecution; and (4) that the person or business being served must have conducted business or engaged in transactions occurring at least in part in the issuing state.

The following measure(s) were previously heard on **February 22, 2013**.

HB 21, HD1
(HSCR561)
Status RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. CPC, JUD
Repeals the prioritization of liens for unpaid mortgages over subsequently recorded liens for unpaid condominium association fees. Clarifies the obligations of the acquirer of a foreclosed unit under the lien for unpaid association fees. Effective July 1, 2012. (HB21 HD1)

HB 25, HD1
(HSCR360)
Status RELATING TO SUSPENSION OF FORECLOSURE ACTIONS BY JUNIOR LIENHOLDERS. CPC, JUD
Allows a condominium association, as a junior lienholder, to commence or continue a nonjudicial foreclosure action on a property subject to a judicial foreclosure. Removes requirement to stay power of sale foreclosure process pending a circuit court foreclosure action. (HB25 HD1)

HB 92
(HSCR258)
Status RELATING TO VOTING. VMI, JUD
Provides that the ballot of an absentee or military-overseas voter is valid even if the voter becomes ineligible to vote after casting the ballot.

HB 146, HD1
(HSCR334)
Status RELATING TO THE TRAFFIC CODE. TRN, JUD
Defines and prohibits the use of dangerous wheels. Effective July 1, 2020. (HB146 HD1)



HB 252, HD1
(HSCR270)
Status

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT.

OMH, JUD

Requires annual reports from the Native Hawaiian Roll Commission.
Amends the definition of "qualified Native Hawaiian" to include individuals who meet certain expanded ancestry requirements.
Repeals directive to amend the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act.
(HB252 HD1)
