<u>SB-978</u> <u>(SSCR487)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE. Imposes a mandatory sentence of one year of imprisonment on a defendant convicted of cruelty to animals in the second degree involving five or more pet animals in any one instance.	JUD
<u>SB-529, SD1</u> <u>(HSCR1015)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PARENTAL RIGHTS. Prohibits family courts from awarding a natural parent custody of or visitation with a child if the natural parent has been convicted of rape or sexual assault and the child was conceived as a result of that offense. Authorizes the family courts to terminate parental rights, with respect to a child, of a convicted natural parent who has been convicted of rape or sexual assault and the child was conceived as a result of the rape or sexual assault. <u>SB-88, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1000)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUORS IN PUBLIC HOUSING. Prohibits possessing open liquor containers in the common areas in public housing projects. Adds "state low income housing project" to the definition of public housing project for purposes of liquor control. Effective July 1, 2030. (SB88 HD1)	HSG, JUD
<u>SB-68, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR496)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SENTENCING. Allows judges discretion in setting incarceration terms when sentencing drug offenders in certain class B and class C felony cases to make the length of the sentence proportionate to the offense and related conduct. Excludes certain offenses. (SD1)	JUD



<u>SB 3, SD1, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR1019)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Provides for the election of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs board members through a system of nonpartisan primary and general elections to begin with the 2014 elections. (SB3 HD1)	OMH, JUD
<u>HCR 106 / HR 81</u> <u>Status / Status</u>	URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO GRANT FULL VOTING RIGHTS FOR RESIDENTS OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.	JUD
<u>HCR 34 / HR 19</u> <u>Status / Status</u>	URGING THE COUNTIES TO DISCONTINUE THE USE OF CARBON MONOXIDE TO EUTHANIZE ANIMALS.	JUD
<u>HCR 18, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR931)</u> <u>Status</u>	REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO ADVISE THE SPECIAL ACTION TEAM ON THE OPTIMAL NUMBER OF FORENSIC EXAMINATIONS NECESSARY FOR FELONY CASES.	HLT/HUS, JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing. **Those wishing to provide oral testimony will be limited to two minutes.**



Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
