<u>SB 10, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR424)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION. Allows the Hawaiian homes commission or the department of Hawaiian home lands to retain independent legal counsel as needed. Authorizes the Hawaiian homes commission and the department of Hawaiian home lands to use the services of the attorney general as needed and when the interests of the State, Hawaiian homes commission, and department of Hawaiian home lands are aligned. Provides that funds paid to independent legal counsel shall be paid by the State. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)	OMH, JUD, FIN
<u>SB 1275, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR586)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE KAHO'OLAWE ISLAND RESERVE COMMISSION. Grants the Kaho'olawe island reserve commission a permanent exemption from chapter 103D, HRS, for the procurement of food or fuel products necessary for the commission to carry out the purposes of chapter 6K, HRS. Effective 07/01/50. (SD1)	OMH, FIN
<u>SB 409, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR474)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MAHINA 'OLELO HAWAI'I. Designates the month of February as "'Olelo Hawaii Month" to celebrate and encourage the use of Hawaiian language. (SD1)	OMH, FIN
<u>SB 407, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR628)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ISLAND BURIAL COUNCILS. Clarifies statutory provisions relating to composition and quorum of island burial councils. (SD1)	OMH, FIN
<u>SB 3, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR691)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Provides for the election of the office of Hawaiian affairs board members through a system of nonpartisan primary and general elections to begin with the 2014 elections. (SD1)	OMH, JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
