| <u>SB 1003</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY. Assigns to the Chief Information Officer the responsibility and authority to direct the development, adoption, and training of policies, procedures, and standards to minimize vulnerability to threats, regularly assess security risks, determine appropriate security measures, and perform security audits of government information systems and data communications infrastructures. | TEC, WAM |
| <u>SB 1000</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO THE ACCESS HAWAII COMMITTEE. Designates the Chief Information Officer or the Chief Information Officer's designee to serve on and chair the Access Hawaii Committee. Effective upon approval. | TEC |
| <u>SB 207</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO SOCIAL MEDIA. Prohibits employers from requiring employees and applicants for employment from disclosing social media usernames or passwords. | TEC, JDL |
| <u>SB 729</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO THE INTERNET PRIVACY. Requires operators of commercial websites or online services that collect personally identifiable information through the Internet about consumers in the State who use the websites or online services to conspicuously post their privacy policies on their websites or through any other reasonably accessible means. | TEC, CPN |
| <u>SB 448</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO OPEN DATA. Requires executive departments, boards, commissions, and agencies to make data available to the public. Absolves State for liability for deficiencies or incomplete data. Requires the CIO to enact rules to address making data sets available to the public. | TEC, JDL |
